**Air Conditioning Cools Hottest Dog In Town**

JACKSONVILLE, Ill., July 11. (P)—The hottest dog in town is a cool canine today. No more hot dog days for him. The mercury has been in the 90s this week and a heavily furred, 250-pound St. Bernard dog was reported dying from the heat. The Jacksonville Journal ran a short story about his plight. There was immediate response. The dog's owner, Major Henri Servais of the Salvation Army, was busy all day answering the telephone from persons who wanted to help. An ice company sent over an air conditioning unit and installed it on Servais' glassed-in back porch. The huge dog isn't moving off the porch, a cool 60 degrees, into the steaming 95 temperatures. One offer of help came from a three-year-old girl who wanted to fan the big dog during the heat wave. But he doesn't need any fanning now. He's air conditioned.

**U. S. Fight On 'Hoppers Will Open Next Spring**

RENO, Nev.—(P)—The federal government has promised to throw its forces into the battle against the plague of grasshoppers moving through Nevada toward Oregon and California. The federal attack will be made next spring — when the eggs hatch. Poison bait and poisoned vegetation will be placed throughout the area, so that the newly-hatched insects can not survive. It is too late now for control measures this season. The grasshoppers are about to die anyway, after laying their eggs. The Federal Government, the State of Nevada, and Oregon and California if those two states wish to, will cooperate in the control program.

**Mindszenty Life Imprisonment Is Upheld By Court**

BUDAPEST, Hungary, July 11. (P)—Hungary's highest court confirmed Josef Cardinal Mindszenty's life prison term for treason today but said he should have been sentenced to death.

The Appeals Court president declared "there is not the slightest doubt" that the stubbornly anti-Communist Roman Catholic primate should have been executed. But, he ruled, the case "lost its original importance with the arrest and sentencing of the cardinal—the people, the Catholic masses, calmed down and the abominable consequences of the case died away."

Although Cardinal Mindszenty had appealed to the National Council of People's Court to reduce the life term imposed last February 8, Prosecutor Gyula Elapl renewed his plea for the death sentence. He called the life sentence too light for the 56-year-old cardinal, who pleaded "partly guilty" to treason, espionage and black market currency dealings in a trial last February. (Unconfirmed reports reaching Germany recently said the Cardinal had been transferred from his Hungarian prison cell to a hospital for the insane.)

**Tollefson Urges Milling Of Wheat In Northwest**

WASHINGTON, July 11.—(P) Rep. Tollefson (R-Wash.) has asked the Army to permit a part of scheduled wheat shipments to Japan and the Orient to be milled into flour in the Pacific Northwest. Tollefson wrote Assistant Secretary Voorhees of the Army that failure to mill wheat in the Pacific Northwest for export shipment as flour is forcing mills to close and throwing many persons out of work. He said that since last January only 11,650 tons of flour

**Texas Legislature Spends Millions To Modernize**

AUSTIN, Tex., July 11.—(P)—The free-spending no-taxing 51st Texas Legislature came to the end of its record-breaking session Wednesday. The 177-day session was the longest in history. Legislative expense reached a new high of nearly a million and a half dollars. It probably will be remembered as the session that did more to extend state services and less to pay the bill than any Legislature in history. When the session began the general fund balance of about \$100,000,000 was the biggest in history. Today all this and millions more are spent. But the state's public school system has been revamped, the long run-down prison system started toward modernization, rural roads and rural schools given a shot in the arm, salaries of state and county workers raised, and a new management system set up for state hospitals.
