#### Negro Held In Fatal Assault On Priest

NEW ORLEANS, July 11 —(AP)—The Rev. John F. Neifert, 68-year-old Catholic priest, died last night of a brain injury. He was struck on the head with an iron hook as he changed vestments after early mass in the Holy Redeemer Church last Friday.

Frank Bates, 42, a Negro stevedore, was held by police for striking the priest. Detective Chief Harry Daniels said Bates was booked on a charge of aggravated battery with intent to commit murder and armed robbery.

#### White House Appearance Changed On \$20 Bill

The picture of the White House which appears on the reverse of all \$20 bills has been brought up-to-date, the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco reminded the public today, following inquiries from many persons who believed the new currency of that denomination now coming into circulation would be counterfeit.

The design heretofore in use showed the south front and grounds of the White House as they appeared in 1929. The new engraving was made from a photograph of the White House south front and grounds as they are today.

Comparison of the two pictures will reveal the presence of additional trees and shrubbery, and of heavier foliage, so that the grounds are a deeper green in the current design. Structural changes in the building include the balcony which has been added at the second floor level, and

four chimneys in place of the two in 1929.

The White House flag, which blew straight out in 1929, hangs at an angle from its staff in the new picture, taken on a windless day. The bottom portions of the windows are of solid color, giving the impression that they are open. Lettering beneath the building has been changed from "White House" to "The White House."

There has been no change in the design for the front of the note.

## Auto Workers Union Ask CIO To Oust All Red-Dominated Affiliates

MILWAUKEE, Wis., July 12.—(AP)—The CIO United Auto Workers voted overwhelmingly yesterday to ask the CIO to throw out all its Communist-dominated affiliates.

It was a smashing victory for UAW President Walter Reuther, who made a vigorous plea to delegates to take the action.

Only about 25 hands were raised in opposition when a resolution dealing with what was called the Communist party's program of disruption was put to a vote.

Reuther described as "without a doubt the strongest anti-Communist resolution ever adopted by a CIO union."

It accused the Communist-dominated unions of failing to organize workers in their jurisdiction. It recommended that their charters be revoked by the CIO convention in Cleveland next November. It also recommended that committees be set up to organize workers in the fields covered by the Communist-dominated unions.

Reuther singled out three unions as the ones which had fallen down most in organizing. These are the United Office and Professional Workers, The United Public Workers and the Food and Tobacco Workers. Altogether 11 CIO unions have been listed by CIO leaders as Communist-dominated.

Earlier maligned Victor Reuther appeared dramatically before the convention and received a standing, cheering ovation. Wearing plaster over his right eye socket and with his right arm in a sling

from an assassination attempt May 25, Victor reviewed briefly some of the union's battles starting with the sitdown strikes of the late 1930s.

"They didn't stop us then and they won't stop us now," he said. The convention unanimously adopted a resolution demanding that the FBI investigate the attempts on the lives of the Reuther brothers. The FBI contends it has no authority to investigate.

The union has offered rewards totaling \$200,000 for information leading to solution of the crimes. Other rewards have added \$17,000 to the offers.

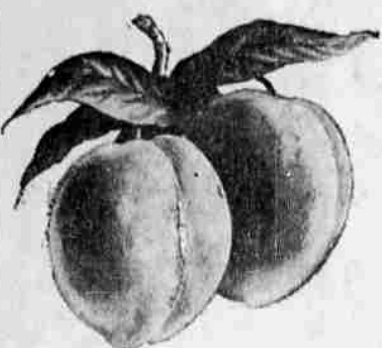
