**Forced Broadcasts By War Prisoners Denied By Jap At Tokyo Rose's Trial**

SAN FRANCISCO, July 15.—(P)—A government witness at the Tokyo Rose treason trial denies the Japanese used brutality or threats to force war prisoners and civilians to broadcast propaganda for Radio Tokyo during the war.  
Counsel for Los Angeles-born Mrs. Iva Toguri (Tokyo Rose) d'Aquino sought in vain yesterday to win from Lt. Col. Shigetetsugu Tsuneishi an admission that brutalities and threats were used.  
Instead he snapped: "No such thing!"  
The painstaking three day cross-examination was part of the defense effort to picture Mrs. d'Aquino as a victim of wartime circumstance, stranded in Japan at war's outbreak and forced to broadcast.  
Mrs. d'Aquino is charged with traitorously broadcasting to United States troops in an effort to hurt their morale and thus impede the nation's war effort.  
Tsuneishi, as the Japanese Army's representative, had direct supervision over several propaganda programs, including "Zero Hour."  
Defense counsel Wayne Collins did win from him an admission that the defendant might have been conscripted into the Army to do radio work if she had refused to do it as a civilian.  
Later, Tsuneishi testified that a remark to that effect he once made concerned all employees of Radio Tokyo, not Mrs. d'Aquino in particular.
