## Gold Centennial Celebration Fails To Draw, Leaves City's Groups In Financial Plight

COLUMBIA, Calif., July 19.—(P)—Columbia was the "gem of the southern (mother lode gold) mines" 100 years ago. Columbians thought its centennial celebration would produce gold, too. Instead, they reaped only severe financial pains.

Only a few thousand visitors came for a three-day weekend celebration of "Columbia, the gem" etc.—climax of California's 1949 centennial schedule. Officials had predicted 80,000.

Some Columbians blamed the heat—108 degrees—for the disinterest. Others cited a rule preventing visitors driving into this little town, 140 miles northwest of San Francisco. Free bus service was provided from a 23-acre parking field a mile out.

Anyhow, this was the way — and it's painfully typical—once enthusiastic Columbians yesterday toted up their deficits:

Tuolumne lodge No. 21, I. O. O. F., spent \$1,600 on booths and refreshments. E. A. Danicourt said "we will be lucky if we took in enough to pay the help."

Mrs. George Burghardt killed 100 chickens and 18 ducks, hoping to sell 250 box lunches. She sold about 20.

Mr. and Mrs. C. E. Harthorne prepared to sell 3,000 hot dogs. They sold less than 200. That meant 2,800 buns left, too.

"We'll be eating bread pudding until Christmas," Mrs. Harthorne moaned.

The Sonora Elks lodge stocked 500 cases of beer; sold about 25.

The Junior Aronas, a group of high school girls, spent \$400 to stock a booth; lost virtually all of it.

Mrs. U. K. Peterson, their sponsor, summed it up this way: "There is something wrong here that we don't know about. There is something twisted about the world today and we just don't know what it is."

## NSLI Policies Must Be Renewed, Vets Reminded

Oregon veterans are reminded that National Service Life Insurance policies must be renewed, or converted to a permanent insurance plan.

The Veterans administration is now sending out notices of expiration to some veterans in the area. Policies issued before January 1, 1946, expire eight years from date of issue. Those issued after that date expire in five years.

All term policies may be renewed for an additional five years, as provided by law. Veterans must fill out a renewal application form and mail it to the VA before the expiration of their policies. The first premium payment must also accompany the application.

Premiums will be slightly higher than on the previous policy since they are based on the age of the veteran at the time of renewal. No physical examination is necessary except in cases where the policy has been lapsed for a longer period than three months.

Veterans who wish to convert their policies to permanent insurance will find six standard plans available. They are: Ordinary life, 20-pay life, 30-pay life, 20-year endowment, endowment at age 60 and endowment at age 65.

Full information on insurance benefits may be obtained at any VA office.

SALEM, July 19.—(P)—Thomas L. Ohlsen, Portland, who has been deputy state milk administrator since 1933, will be temporary milk administrator under the new milk control setup.

The State Board of Agriculture decided Monday to give the job to Ohlsen until the board can name a permanent administrator.

A new law, effective last Saturday, gives the board of agriculture power to name the administrator.

Until then, the administrator was the director of agriculture, E. L. Peterson, appointed by the governor.
