REEDSPORT

Vaino Pajari, Ex-Dairy Rancher, Leaves By Air For Old Country

Vaino Pajari of Reedspport, a native of Finland, left for his old home Thursday night for a few months' visit, making the trip entirely by plane. Mr. Pajari operated a large dairy ranch near here for many years, until the death of his wife.

He moved to Reedspport recently and has been a night watchman at the Umpqua River Navigation company plant on the waterfront.

He left the North Bend airport Thursday night and expected to be in Helsinki, Finland, Sunday. Eagerly looking forward to the wonderful trip and the chance to visit his old home, Vaino had not fully decided just how long he would stay away. His son, Arnie Pajari, lives here.

Deep Sea Crabbing Discontinued

Deep sea crabbing has been discontinued along the coast adjacent to the Umpqua river, and crab pots are being brought in, repaired and stored until the fall season.

Packing crab meat has been discontinued at the Anton Hoel plant in Reedspport and at the Columbia River Packers association plant, as well as at the Charles Marks plant at Winchester Bay.

The Polly Ann, fished here during the past season by Don Mills of Charleston, under lease to Anton Hoel, has been sold by Mar-den & Hagist, owners, and is now at Newport being prepared for tuna fishing.

The We of Coos Bay, owned by Jesse Weinel but fished by Jack Farley during the past season, is bringing in pots for storage. Except for the first of the season, only fair catches were made.

Disastrous Fire Averted

What could have been a disastrous fire was narrowly averted Saturday evening at the E. K. Wood Lumber company sawmill in Reedspport, when a watchman saw smoke coming from under the dock near the planing mill when the mill was not in operation.

Quick action on the part of the Reedspport volunteer fire department is credited with saving at least part of the buildings in the mill yard, and possibly the dry kiln and mill itself. A hard wind was blowing when the fire started, presumably from a spark from the mill's burner.


Cattle Thieves Active

Mr. and Mrs. Ray Dalley of Smith river were business visitors in Reedspport Tuesday. They report cattle thieves active on the north fork of Smith river, with several hundred dollars worth of stock having been taken from the Wroe Brothers ranch recently. State and county officers are reportedly working on the case.
