Copco Income Upped For 12-Month Period

According to a statement issued by A. S. Cummins, president, The California Oregon Power company reports net income for the twelve months ending June 30, 1949, of \$2,109,581 as compared with net income of \$1,829,254 for the corresponding period ending June 1948, an increase of 15.32%.

Net income for the twelve months ending June 30, 1949, was equivalent to 5.09 times preferred stock dividend requirements, and, after deduction of such dividends, was equivalent to \$3.08 per share on the 550,000 shares of outstanding common stock.

Net income for the six months ending June 30, 1949, amounted to \$1,059,414, an increase of 15.70% over that of the same period of 1948.

What No Beer? Wording Charged To Tokyo Rose

SAN FRANCISCO, July 25.—(AP)—"What, no beer?" mused the lady known as Tokyo Rose. "What sort of a war is this? Well, let's sing first, then write letters afterwards. Maybe he'll run a pipeline to you."

A New York writer, Dale Kramer, testified at the treason trial of Iva Toguri D'Aquino that he jotted down those remarks from one of the defendant's scripts of a Radio Tokyo broadcast to United States troops. The occasion was in early September, 1945, after the surrender, when as a reporter for "Yank" he interviewed Miss Toguri.

The three-week-old trial of the Los Angeles-born defendant recessed until today. She is charged with eight acts of treason through her activities for Radio Tokyo during the war.

Argentinian Reported Giving Italians Money

ROME, July 25.—(AP)—Someone in Argentina is reported showering so much money on residents of the north Italian city of Modena that police there are getting curious.

The mysterious benefactor calls himself only "an emigrant from Modena." Dispatches say he has been sending postal money orders for \$50 each to Modenese—mainly students. So far some \$2,500 is reported to have been arranged. The dispatches said none of the recipients has relatives in Argentina. Last night police halted payments, while they tried to find out the identity of the source.

Employment In Oregon Expected To Increase Soon

SALEM, July 25.—(AP)—The next few months are expected to be easier on job-hunters in Oregon.

The state unemployment compensation commission said a survey indicated late August and early September should find about 5 per cent more workers on payrolls.

Food processing, construction, lumbering and retail trade are the most likely prospects for anyone looking for work, the report said.

The commission reported: 1—Construction employment has gone up 10 per cent since April; should climb as much more before the fall peak.

2—Food processing plants will have a total of only slightly below last year's 26,500 top number of workers.

3—Lumbering expects about 7 per cent more men on the job for August-September—but notes the industry still is 12,000 jobs behind the 1948 level at this time last year.

4—Textiles and apparel plants expect October will see 9 per cent more persons on the payrolls than in June.

5—Retail tradesmen expect an upswing in business—will need about 9 per cent more workers in October than in June.

6—Transportation and communication employees see a slight drop by late summer.

7—Wholesale firms believe payrolls will go up slightly for late summer, then decline again by mid-fall.
