SEATTLE July 27—Woodrow Wilson Delawder pleaded guilty Tuesday to a bigamy charge for a wartime wife in England and a postwar wife here. The 35-year-old aircraft worker has a child by each.

Prosecutor Charles O. Carroll said he would recommend that a prison sentence be deferred five years on condition that he pay \$30 a month for the support of the British child, while the wife there can obtain a divorce. The plural marriage was disclosed after wife no. 1 complained to the British consul here that Delawder had failed to support her and their son.
