

Social Security Expansion Chances At Present Session Of Congress Are Brightened

WASHINGTON, July 29.—(AP)—The outlook for President Truman's program for social security expansion brightened Thursday with a House committee call for restoration of about 750,000 workers to the old age insurance rolls. The ways and means committee voted 15 to 10, strictly on party lines, to repeal the "Gearhart amendment" enacted by the Republican-controlled 80th Congress. This amendment, sponsored by former Rep. Gearhart (R-Calif.), excluded from the insurance program certain commission salesmen, life insurance salesmen, pieceworkers, truck drivers, taxicab drivers, miners, journeymen tailors and others. Mr. Truman vetoed the Gearhart bill when it was passed last year. Congress promptly overrode him. The ways and means democrats voted solidly yesterday to undo that action of the 80th Congress. The 10 republicans stood solidly against the democrats. The committee then turned to

Home Opened To Boy, 7, Who Shot 'Frisco Grocer

SAN FRANCISCO, July 28.—(AP)—Doors of an Aberdeen, Wash., logger's home were opened yesterday for 7-year-old Teddy Moreno, who is held for the recent shooting of an elderly San Francisco grocer. It will be up to juvenile authorities whether the offer will be accepted. The offer to provide a home for the little fellow came from Mr. and Mrs. Edward Rutherford. They said they had two children of their own and "it doesn't take much more to feed another." Teddy is the boy who picked up a pistol while wandering behind the counter of grocer Fred Throckmorton. A coroner's jury held the grocer's death to have been accidental. The boy had aimed the weapon playfully at the grocer. It went off when he pulled the trigger. "If no one else has taken Teddy Moreno, we would like to try to make him happy and carefree like little boys his age should be," Mrs. Rutherford wrote to Homicide Inspector Alfred J. Nelder. Nelder suggested the Rutherfords write to Juvenile Court Judge Milton Sapiro. When juvenile authorities took the boy into custody, they criticized his home environment.



Russia's Superior Manpower Offset By Discontent Among Her Satellites

During his twenty years of dictatorship the sixty-year-old Salazar has established the reputation of being one of the world's most astute rulers. Therefore when he makes a public statement, which he rarely does, he merits attention. Of course he was putting pressure on his legislature to ratify the Atlantic Pact (which it did Wednesday by a vote of 80 to 3). But that fact in itself needn't detract from the validity of his estimate. Hospitals Will Dine On Elk Slain In Douglas Woods

Anyone who can manipulate his way into the Veterans hospital or county hospital for a week's stay as a patient might be well repaid. Patients in those two hospitals are to feast on elk meat, according to Sgt. Dick Miles, state policeman at Reedsport. Wesley Harrison, Loon lake, recently was granted a permit to kill elk causing damage to his farm. Harrison delivered five carcasses to the state police. Miles reports that the animals were promptly dressed out and placed in storage and are now being held in a cooler room at Reedsport. The Veterans hospital and County hospital at Roseburg will each receive one of the carcasses. Others will go to the Shrine hospital for crippled children at Portland, the Masonic home for the aged at Forest Grove and Kizer hospital, North Bend. Miles reports considerable resentment because Harrison killed so many animals. His permit has been withdrawn. The kill included three adult bulls, one spike bull and one cow elk. The animals were killed in the late evening, were dressed out and placed in storage before daylight so carcasses are in excellent condition, Miles reports.

Big Judgment Won On Life Insurance Contract

PORTLAND, July 29.—(AP)—A \$96,132 judgment on a life insurance contract was won by Joseph L. Gilbert, Sweet Home logging operator, in a memorandum decision here of Federal Judge Claude McCulloch. Gilbert said he had taken out a policy on the life of his partner, Floyd Eaton, and the Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance company of Milwaukee refused to pay. The company answered that Eaton suffered a heart ailment at the time he took out the policy and failed to report that to the company. Judge McCulloch ruled that there was no intent to deceive and under Oregon law intent is an essential part of deceit. The judge said Eaton was aware of pains in his chest but thought them trivial.

Vets Boost Borrowing To Purchase Farms

SALEM, July 29.—(AP)—Oregon veterans borrowed \$3,986,350 from the state to buy farms and homes during the first half of 1949, the state department of veterans affairs reports. This was 21 per cent greater than in the first half of 1948, but it was 17 per cent less than the high mark in the last half of 1948. The total amount of loans given to veterans since the program began in 1945 is \$14,436,289. The loans were granted to 3,678 veterans. Loans carry 4 per cent interest. A veteran can borrow up to 75 per cent of the value of a farm or home, with a \$6,000 maximum.
