The National Guard rifle range will be a busy place Saturday and Sunday as members of the Roseburg Rifle club take over for a two-day regional shoot.

Top rifle men from the Pacific Northwest and California will compete for honors on the newly-completed range located 1 1/2 miles east of Roseburg on the North Umpqua road. The meet will be conducted by National Rifle association rules, with the sanction and approval of the N. R. A. The meet will start at 8 a. m. both days.

Ken Gilkeson, vice president of the local club, said a number of persons are under the false impression the shoot is being held at the Rod and Gun club's range at Winchester. He wished to correct this impression and stated that the new National Guard range will be the site of the first regional rifle match to be held in Roseburg.

No admission will be charged spectators and Gilkeson said there will be plenty of free parking space available.
