### Civic Betterment Group To Test Law Validity

SPOKANE, Aug. 1.—(AP)—The committee of 1,000, a civic betterment group, had this ammunition today in its campaign to eliminate slot machines from private clubs.

Prosecutor Leslie Carroll is ready to go into the courts to "wipe out slot machines" if Spokane police stage a raid and bring one of the gambling devices in as evidence.

Commissioner of Public Safety Carl D. Canwell is willing to furnish the prosecutor with enough men for a raid, "or he can get them from the sheriff's office."

Carroll made his statement of readiness for action before the committee yesterday, but said he was unsure whether the state supreme court would uphold a raid on the slots. The high court has not decided whether the machines are legal.

The prosecutor's comment came after the prosecutor's remarks were made public. The safety commissioner said Carroll could initiate a raid at any time and did not have to rely on the police.

### Dethroned Cherry Champ Challenges New Claimant

THE DALLES, Ore., Aug. 1.—(AP)—Henry M. Wootton, the dethroned cherry-picking champion, challenged the new champ today.

The wiry, 36-year-old Wootton declared he thought he could better the mark of 2,431 pounds which Walt Bailey picked in a single day at La Grande. "I'll take him on anywhere," Wootton said. "My feelings are little hurt."

It was in 1946 that Wootton, a Stockton, Calif., resident, claimed the "world cherry-picking record" by harvesting 2,168 pounds of cherries in a one-day contest at Hood River.

The mark stood until Bailey, who said he wasn't even trying, went out for his usual working day at La Grande this week and turned in 2,431 pounds.

### Pacific Grain Growers Protest Port Action

ASTORIA, Aug. 1.—(AP)—The North Pacific Grain Growers charged that the attitude of the Port of Astoria commission will force them to dump 300,000 bushels of grain on the ground.

A. E. Sutton, general manager of the growers, said the port has refused to rent enough storage space for the grain coming here for export. The growers have hoped to convert Astoria into a major storage and shipping point for wheat.

## Unemployment in July Reaches New Summer High

Payments to Oregon's unemployed in July climbed to \$1,201,455, an increase of \$87,597 from June and the highest mid-summer month on record with the exception of 1946 when thousands of war workers and returning veterans were looking for jobs, the State Unemployment Compensation commission reported today.

Veterans allowances dropped slightly from the previous month to \$392,422 but were nearly double the \$207,876 paid out in July, 1948. Workers covered by the state law drew \$809,013, an increase of 17 per cent from June and more than double the \$370,485 of a year ago.

With more than 28,500 claims on file for the new benefit year (starting July 1, 1949), the number of state checks issued during the last week of July rose to 14,235, highest for nearly three months and exceeded by only a few mid-winter weeks during 1948. New claimants increased 78 per cent over a year ago.

An influx of new state claims is expected early in August from the four to six thousand veterans who have been drawing readjustment allowances under the GI bill of rights, which expires for about 94 per cent of former service men with the end of July. Nearly 60 per cent of these veterans have sufficient wage credits (\$400 or more) in 1948 to qualify for state benefits. Of 85,000 Oregon veterans who applied for help from federal funds, about 6,800 exhausted their rights and about 5,800 will have additional time in which to draw allowances.

### Progressive Candidate Will Become Democrat

WASHINGTON, Aug. 1.—(AP)—Sen. Glen Taylor (D-Idaho), who ran for vice president last November on the Progressive ticket, said last night he would run again for senator, as a Democrat.

"I've always been a Democrat in the sense that I always believed in the things Franklin D. Roosevelt stood for," he said in an interview on the Mutual Broadcasting system's "Meet the Press" program.

"I'm pretty thoroughly convinced," Henry A. Wallace's running mate added, "that our political destiny rests with the two major political parties, that the American people do not want any splinter parties."

## Police Still On Alert For Escaped Prisoners

SALEM, Aug. 1.—(AP)—Police still are on the alert for John Pinson and Harvey Benson, two months after the pair made a spectacular escape from the state penitentiary here.

They climbed over a prison wall Memorial day while a guard pumped bullets at them. So far as can be learned, no one has seen them since.

Scores thought they did at first. Classed as dangerous, the convicts were reported in a dozen places, and the search was energetic. None of the reports was authenticated, however, and gradually the active search was abandoned.

The watch goes on, though. The private opinion of some officials is that the two headed at once for a hide-out in some secluded place, and have not yet emerged. Police throughout the state are waiting for the break that may renew the search.

Pinson, a lifer convicted of killing a state policeman in the mid-Columbia river area, is regarded

as the more dangerous. His partner, Benson, was serving a term for armed robbery.
