(Continued From Page One) brotherly relations." He said this statement also applied to Albania, Yugoslavia's tiny neighbor to the south. Tralcho Kostov, former vice premier of Bulgaria and former member of the central committee of the Bulgarian communist party, was expelled from the party in June after being charged with nationalism and an unfriendly attitude toward the Soviet union. At about the same time, former deputy premier Xoxe of Albania was executed after being convicted of treason. Xoxe had been reported siding with Tito in his quarrel with the cominform. Referring to two other communist neighbors of Yugoslavia, Tito said the cominform campaign against him had unleashed "chauvinistic passions" in Hungary and Romania. "Can't Be Intimidated" He said leading communists in those countries were "quite audibly whispering" that something could be wrenched from Yugoslavia because it was "capitalist," while their countries were "socialist." "We tried with the greatest sacrifices," Tito declared, "to create the closest relations with the people of those countries. But it was in the interests of some people to spoil those relations." He said the Yugoslav people "cannot be shaken nor intimidated from firmly persisting in their struggle for the freedom, integrity and independence of their socialist homeland." The occasion for Tito's speech was the fifth anniversary of the people's republic of Macedonia, a federal state within Yugoslavia. He has gone to considerable lengths to assure the part of the country of equal treatment, but his speech dealt sternly with the question of an independent Macedonia.

(Continued from page 1) against the Soviet Union." Other Pointed Questions Smith charged that this Soviet system was spreading to "the so-called popular democracies of eastern Europe." "This is no doubt one of the main reasons for the tremendous exodus from eastern Europe and the Soviet zone of Germany which we have witnessed in recent years and which still continues—a flight of millions to the west." Why, he asked, should workers flee from "the workers' paradise?" The British government has not explained how the copy of the codex came into its possession. "Why must the Soviet Union guard its forced labor camps like some shameful secret?" Smith asked.

LONDON, Aug. 3.—(AP)—Russia accused Marshal Tito today of using Greek Communist refugees as slave labor in the Yugoslav iron and copper mines. The official Soviet news agency Tass said the metal is sold to Americans and "made into guns for the Greek Royalist Fascists." At one time the western allies regarded Yugoslavia as a main refuge and jumping-off place for Greek rebels ducking back and forth across the border in their skirmishes with government troops. Recently, Tito ordered the border sealed. He said the Greek Communists had "taken sides against him along with the nations of the Russian-dominated Cominform. The Cominform denounced Tito last year for putting nationalism above the Communist party line.

(Continued From Page One) very cordial atmosphere." Merger Sought Well-informed sources here said the U. S. chiefs of staff want the five western union powers to merge their forces and defense resources into a tightly-knit Atlantic pact framework. Some degree of reluctance against such a full-scale merger has been unofficially reported among the western union partners. The informants said the U. S. military chiefs hope to get an agreement on unification to allay any doubt among members of the U. S. congress that the Atlantic treaty partners might not pull together as a team in case of aggression. Denfield, Bradley and Vandenberg have carefully and specially said their current tour does not include discussion of President Truman's \$1,450,000,000 arms aid program because it is still being debated by congress. But other officials here feel that failure to agree on unification would jeopardize congressional approval of arms aid. Tomorrow they are scheduled to meet Norwegian and Danish military leaders who are coming to London.

Sheriff Carter said the third car, driven by Bernard E. Pfeiffer, Nampa, Idaho, ran into the rear of the Hill vehicle following the initial collision. No other injuries were reported and no estimate of damage to the vehicles was given.

Polio-Stricken Woman's Baby Fails To Survive

EVERETT, Wash., Aug. 3.—(AP)—A baby born to a polio-stricken woman Monday died in a hospital here yesterday afternoon, less than 24 hours later. Mrs. Jacklyn Lee, 19, was removed from an iron lung for delivery of the premature three-pound girl Monday. She had been admitted to the hospital only two days previously. She was stricken suddenly with polio in the seventh month of pregnancy. Dr. John J. Fiorino had raced against time in the 20 minutes the young mother was out of the mechanical breathing device. An attendant gave Mrs. Lee artificial respiration and pumped oxygen into her lungs by hand.

Postwar Building Regulation "Farce," Housing Expediter Woods Declares

WASHINGTON, Aug. 3.—(AP)—Housing Expediter Tighe Woods said Tuesday he told Senate that his agency's postwar building regulation was a "farce." Woods spent 90 minutes with the staff of the senate's special investigating subcommittee and afterwards told newsmen that the names of both James V. Hunt and John Maragon figured in the closed door session. Hunt, a former army officer who now is a "management counselor" here, is a key figure in the senate inquiry. Maragon, fabulous former Kansas City bootblack who now calls many top government officials by their first names, appeared before the staff of the special investigating subcommittee the three consecutive days last week. Woods said over the weekend that committee investigation had found Hunt mentioned in the housing agency's files in connection with postwar construction work at San Bruno, Calif., and Foxborough, near Boston. Woods said then that in the Tanforan case, Hunt asked the housing agency to give favorable consideration to a 1947 application for a go-ahead on construction work at the track. He also said that Hunt "sought our opinion" as to whether the Foxborough track could qualify for a green light on construction work. Hunt was advised, Woods said, that the track was eligible. The housing expediter said he understands that Hunt was paid a \$15,000 fee by his client in the Foxborough case. He could not name the client.

Counterfeit Gang's Reputed Head Nabbed

NEW YORK, Aug. 3.—(AP)—Secret service agents Tuesday arrested the reputed head of a counterfeit gang that allegedly has been flooding the eastern seaboard with more than a million dollars in 10 and 20 dollar bills. U. S. Commissioner Edward W. McDonald held the prisoner, Michael Malone, 38, a New Yorker, in \$50,000 bail for the grand jury. Assistant U. S. attorney Roy M. Cohn said "the arrest of Malone means a crushing blow to the counterfeiting activities throughout the nation."

KLAMATH FALLS, Aug. 3.—(AP) Steady improvement was shown Tuesday by 31-year-old Edward Freuer who was rescued from a rock field high on Mt. McLoughlin Monday after he had tumbled down a boulder-strewn cliff. X-ray pictures showed the husky Poe valley farm youth and football player had a chipped shoulder but no other broken bones. He is battered, bruised and lacerated, but his physician described his condition as "remarkable" in view of the nature of the accident and the 16 hours spent on a stretcher during the rescue. Freuer was able to sit up and present a vastly different appearance than on arrival by ambulance here Monday.
