Roseburg Defeats Ashland At Tennis In Doubles Edge

The Roseburg Tennis club, crippled by the loss of Norman Moore, who was out with an attack of polio, and Bill Garrison, who was in Portland, had to win 2 out of the 3 doubles matches to gain a victory. The singles play ended with the score at 3-3, but Roseburg then took all of the three doubles matches, to win 6-3, according to Marlen Yoder, YMCA general secretary.

The most tightly fought match of the day was the third singles between Tom Lindbloom of Roseburg and Harry Kannasto of Ashland. Lindbloom took a 4-1 game lead, only to see it vanish and Kannasto win five straight games and take the first set 6-4.

After an exchange of leads the second set was tied at 4-4, then Lindbloom swung through and took two straight games and the set 6-4.

The final set was a repeat of the other two, with Lindbloom holding the advantage. However, after tying it at 6-6, Kannasto won two straight games and the set and match 8-6. It was a well played match and a battle to the end.

Glen Boyer and Dick Joy tied in another thrilling match, then Boyer lost out in two overextended sets, 7-5, 9-7. Tom Jacobson, playing number two man, linked up with Mel Fader. Each proceeded to exhaust the other with severe beatings. Many good volleys were seen in this match which finally ended by Fader winning 6-3, 0-6, 6-1.

Earl Garrison, filling in for one of the absent men, gave Don Kerr a real lesson in place shooting and smooth tennis to overwhelm Kerr 6-1, 6-2. Don Debernardi returned to the Roseburg squad to play a very fast match and run Dorothy Morris right off the tennis courts to the tune of 6-0, 6-0. Bob Berris, playing some very good tennis, and using a driving game very effectively beat George Phife 7-5, 6-1.

Doubles Decide Match
In the doubles play Roseburg started working as a team and put the ball where the other team could not reach it. Earl Garrison and Bert Randall teamed up to put on a show of some fine tennis and win the match from Joy and Fader 6-1, 6-2. Louie Miles and Roy Brutter tackled Harry Kannasto and Bob Phillips and took very little time in disposing of them 6-1, 6-2. Tom Jacobson and Glen Boyer showed they could play winning tennis, beat Dorothy Morris and Gene Morris, 6-2, 6-0.

Roseburg enjoyed playing the Ashland bunch and hope to continue the relationship next year, reports Yoder. A tennis match will be played at Medford next week with Moore, Lindbloom, Boyer, B. Garrison, T. Jacobson and D. Debernardi making the trip. A tentative home match is planned with Yoncalla and scheduled to play here are Bob Berris, Paul Carey, Roy Van Horn, L. Henninger, M. Yoder and a sixth man to be picked later.

Scholarships Offered To Oregon State FFA

SALEM, Aug. 15—(AP)—A pair of \$300 scholarships and \$750 convention funds have been given to Oregon Future Farmers of America by Standard Oil company of California. Ralph L. Morgan, state supervisor of agricultural education, said.

The scholarships are to be awarded to any two of the five Oregon state F. F. A. officers to be used within one year after date of the award. The convention funds will provide expenses for three state delegates to the National convention of the Young Farmers' organization in Kansas City in October.

Concrete Harmed When Dried Out Too Rapidly

Concrete poured during hot weather needs protection against too rapid drying which frequently results in hairline cracking, states M. G. Huber, O. S. C. extension agricultural engineer. Slow drying gives more strength and makes concrete more water-tight, he adds.

Best concrete results from drying or curing that takes at least 10 days. Prolonged drying may be accomplished by covering concrete that has had time to "set" with burlap, straw, earth, or some other material which will hold water. Then keep the covering wet, Huber concludes.
