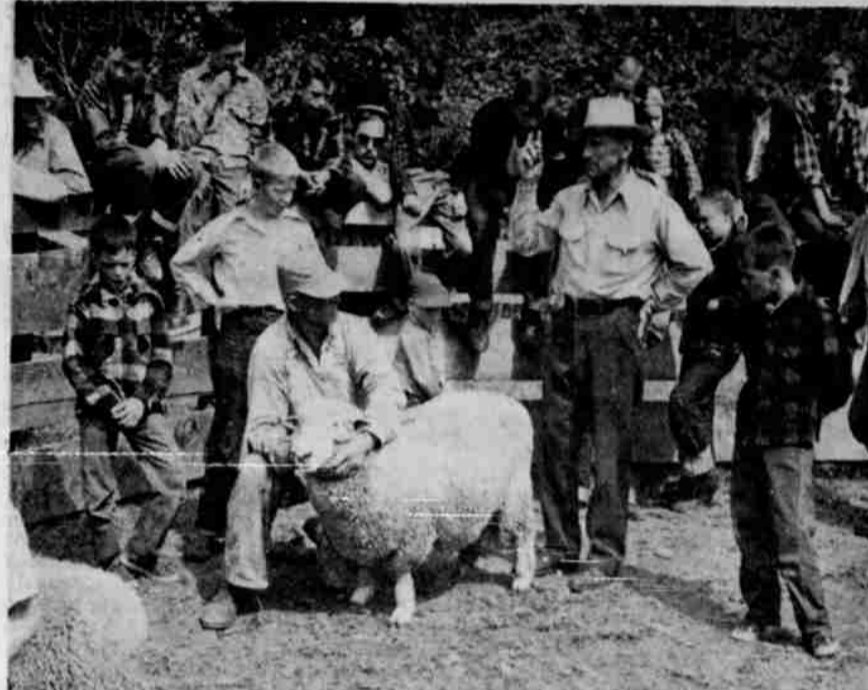
The lodge voted to "adopt" a resident of the fraternal home for special remembrance on birthdays, Christmas, or other occasions. A name will be requested from the matron of the home.
