Lumber Output In July Lagged Behind Orders

PORTLAND, Aug. 18—(AP)—Demand for Douglas fir lumber during July forced orders 25 million feet a week above production, according to H. V. Simpson, executive vice president of West Coast Lumbermen's Association. The lumber official said there was a general strengthening of demand as mid-summer home and construction building hit its stride.

Orders for July averaged 149,926,000 board feet weekly, Simpson stated, while production lagged behind, due to vacations and shutdowns for repairs, averaging only 125,000,000 board feet a week. Shipments bettered production slightly, averaging 129,845,000 board feet weekly.

Simpson said that lumber orders for the first thirty weeks of 1949 totaled 4,688,554,000 board feet, topping total production for the same period as well as shipments. Production through July was 4,583,144,000 board feet and

Witness Denies Reds Plan Bloody Revolution

NEW YORK, Aug. 18—(AP)—A defense witness at the red conspiracy trial said Monday that American communists are a greatly misunderstood group, and that an American revolution would not be "something bloody."

The witness, Howard Johnson, the party's educational director in New York state, said a U. S. revolution would mean:

"The majority of the working people no longer want to tolerate things as they are, and would take steps to change the rule from one class to another class."

A revolution, he declared, would not mean "a small group of conspirators marching upon Washington with bombs and clubs to tear down the pillars of the White House and Capitol."

Johnson was the 18th defense witness at the seven-month-old trial of eleven top communists leaders. They are charged with conspiracy to advocate violent overthrow of the government.

Tokyo Rose Sheds Tears At Evidence In Her Behalf

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 18—(AP)—Tokyo Rose's first defense witness—an ex-Australian army major who wrote her scripts—contradicted Wednesday two of the eight overt acts the U.S. government contends were treason.

The witness, Charles Cousens, broke down the heretofore calm of Mrs. Iva Toguri D'Aquino Tuesday when he recounted how the California-born woman brought food and medicine to allied prisoners of war. She sobbed quietly as he spoke.

The government charges that the defendant committed treason when she broadcast from radio Tokyo and was dubbed by American servicemen Tokyo Rose. She was identified as "Orphan Annie" on the program called the Zero Hour.

A long line of prosecution witnesses, including American soldiers and sailors, have testified they heard her broadcast such statements as:

"I'm going to get my loving—how about you. . . It's futile to fight the Japanese; they have the will to win. They never give up." Cousens told the federal court jury that he never heard her make such a broadcast—that he never prepared such a script. A prisoner of war himself, Cousens worked at radio Tokyo until June, 1944.

He testified she never alluded to American ship losses; instead, he said, they tried by reference to allied successes.

Two of the overt acts charged by the government involved the American film, "Gone With The Wind." The government charges that the battle and hospital scenes on the sound track were used in a broadcast. Iva, the government contends, participated in discussions of the script for the program and also introduced the program over the air.

These, it charges, were overt acts between March 1 and June 1 of 1944. Cousens testified that

Wider Social Security Given Committee O. K.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 18—(AP)—A vast expansion of the nation's social security program, in line with President Truman's recommendations, was approved formally by the House Ways and Means committee Tuesday.

The vote was a top-heavy, 22 to 3. Supporting the legislation were 15 democrats and seven republicans. Opposing were three republicans.

House leaders indicated they will seek action on the bill before Congress adjourns. But the Senate probably will not act until 1950, because of the legislative logjam there.
