**Uranium Bearing** 

Ore Found Near
Roslyn, Wash.

ELLENSBURG, Wash. Aug. 18
—P—Ore classified by the Bureau of Mines at Salt Lake City as uranium bearing has been located on Fortune creek, 27 miles above Roslyn in northern Kittites county, it was reported here.

The ore is on the property of the Big Dome Mining company, headed by Homer King, former operator of the K and L Mine Essay company in Seattle.

Test holes show the ore to be a localized formation roughly 2-000 feet long and from 300 to 600 feet in width. Buildozers have done considerable work in the area and mine officials report that the Geiger counter goes "clear to the top" in test holes.

King found the ore while working on tungsten mining property two years ago and built his own laboratory in Roslyn to study the ores and methods of extracting the atomic substances. It is reported that the ore is one of two samples submitted from all parts of the west to contain uranium.

King said he plans to develop the property commercially if the find can be developed at a profit.
