Canadian Ships Given Alaskan Service Right

WASHINGTON, Aug. 24-(A)-

WASHINGTON, Aug. 24—(37)—
President Truman has signed a bill permitting limited operation of Canadian ships in Alaskan service until next June 30.

The legislation allows Canadian vessels to operate between Skagway, Haines and other Alaskan ports and between Hyder, Alaska, and other Alaskan and United States ports.

Sponsors of the legislation said it is necessary because United States ships do not adequately serve some isolated Alaskan citites and may not be in a position to do so until next year.
