Building Bids' Opening Slated PORTLAND, Aug. 22.—(AP)—Bids for the new State Highway department building in Salem will be opened here Sept. 20. The Highway Commission decided Friday to open the bids at the next regular commission meeting. The commission in a brief session also approved spending of \$300,000 as the state's contribution toward a proposed \$4,000,000 highway around Meridian dam.

Credit Problems Are Discussed At Retailers' Meet

Problems encountered in participating in the program offered by the newly-formed Douglas County Retail Credit association were discussed at a dinner meeting Tuesday night attended by approximately 35 association members. R. C. Rennie, president of the association, reminded members that the organization was a medium of information or an advisory agency and stressed the need for complete cooperation from all members. He said the effectiveness of the organization would depend upon the completeness of the files from which all members would receive information concerning accounts. Rennie said that between 20,000 and 30,000 accounts should be turned in to the association office by Sept. 1 in order to set up the machinery to operate the organization. William Gerretsen, explaining the delinquent accounts forms supplied association members, listed the information wanted, including the code number given each member firm, name, address and occupation of the account, and the manner of payment, or non-payment, as the case may be. Problem Accounts Invited In addition to the complete account list to be turned in by member firms Sept. 1, members were urged to submit a list of five problem accounts by Sept. 15. Two lists of all such accounts will be compiled and returned to the members, who in turn will indicate the ledger experience with each account and return this list to the association. The other copy of problem accounts will be reviewed by the members and brought to regular association meetings where these accounts will be discussed. Rennie explained problem accounts which are 60 days past the agreed date due or those accounts which have required more than one statement to be mailed. Rennie further reminded those present that the association offers its membership an opportunity to discuss problem accounts on a monthly basis, in addition to individual and group credit standing furnished on request. Officers of the Douglas County Retail Credit association include Rennie, president; Gerretsen, vice-president; and Gordon Stewart, secretary-treasurer. Board members include Fred Lockwood, chairman; Rennie, Gerretsen, Stewart, Dr. E. A. Neure, E. A. Springer, Abe Bean, Mrs. Jean Whitteburg, Robert Bashford and Leonard Johansen. Appointed last night by Rennie to head special committees were Robert Neure, membership; W. C. Holmes, credit bureau service; Mrs. S. V. Wright, publicity; William Gerretsen, entertainment and educational; and Robert Bashford and E. A. Springer, reception.
