Retainers meet Problems encountered in par-ticipating in the program offered by the newly-formed Douglas County Retail Credit association were discussed at a dinner meet-ing Tuesday night attended by ap-proximately 35 association mem-bers. R. C. Rennie, president of the association, reminded members that the organization was a medium of information or an ad-visory agency and stressed the need for complete cooperation from all members. He said the effectiveness of the organization would depend upon which all members would depend upon which all members would depend upon the completeness of the files from which all members would receive information concerning accounts. Rennie said that between 20,000 and 30,000 accounts should be turned in to the association office by Sep. 1 in order to set up the machinery to operate the organi-zoton. The other copy of problem accounts will be re-tained by the members and brought to regular association meetings where these accounts will be discussed.
