Chicago's Hornets Beat Buffalo Bills 17 To 14

CHICAGO, Aug. 27.—(AP) The frost still isn't on the pumpkin and Chicago's revitalized and re-named entry already has matched its entire 1948 all-American conference output of one victory.

Chicago's Hornets, formerly the Rockets, scraped a 17-14 triumph over the eastern champion Buffalo Bills in the AAC's earliest start since it began operations in 1946 before 23,800 at Soldier field last night.

A 21-yard field goal by end Jim McCarthy with less than three minutes left broke a 14-14 deadlock and gave the Chicago entry its first loop decision since Sept. 10, 1945, when the Rockets defeated the Baltimore Colts, 21-14.

In an exhibition tilt at Akron's Rubber Bowl last night, the league champion Cleveland Browns outlasted the New York Yankees 28-21.

Challenging Round Set In Davis Cup Finals

FOREST HILLS, N. Y., Aug. 27.—(AP) Unless Australia's Davis Cup hopefuls can emulate their predecessors of a decade ago, the big silver bowl that stands for international tennis supremacy will stay right here in the United States for at least another year.

Having wrapped up both of the opening singles matches against the Aussies in the challenge round here yesterday, the Americans needed only one more triumph in the best-of-five series as the two teams squared off today for the lone doubles encounter.

Wimbledon champion Ted Schroeder got the Yanks off to a good start yesterday when he outlasted Australia's Billy Sidwell, 6-1, 5-7, 4-6, 6-2, 6-3, in the curtain-raiser.

Then the U. S. titleholder, Richard (Pancho) Gonzales, followed with a straight-set triumph over the Australian champion, Frank Sedgman, 8-6, 6-4, 9-7.
