# **Reports Soviet** Side Pretty Bad

Reed Professor

PORTLAND—(P)—A Reed college political science professor, back from a visit on both sides of Europe's "Iron Curtain." finds things pretty good on the western side and pretty bad on the Soviet side.

Dr. Frank Munk, who led a Columbia university study tour sponsored jointly by Reed col-lege, said that in his native counlege, said that in his native country of Czechoslovakia he found Prague "drab and gray, people ill clad, everybody unhappy and afraid to talk. Only, three years ago they were hopeful and production was getting up. I couldn't have believed it if I hadn't seen it with my own eyes."

But there is disunity and in Czechoslovakia 30 percent of the people are "radishes Red outside and white inside."

In western Europe Dr. Munk found the peak danger of Communism passed but "the great trial will come in 1952 when the Marshall plan is supposed to end."
