Guerrillas Still Rove Greece In Spite Of Repulse

NEW YORK, Sept. 22—(AP)—The United Nations Special Commission on the Balkans said today the Greek army has eliminated organized guerrilla resistance along the northern borders of Greece.
This does not mean that the civil war is ended. Communist-led guerrilla bands still rove parts of the interior. The Greek army's recently concluded offensive drove rebel detachments across the Albanian frontier, as other offensive bands have done before. Each time in the past, the guerrillas have reorganized and returned.
The Greek general staff announced in Athens last night 13 Albanian soldiers who surrendered to Greek frontier guards reported that guerrilla leaders hoped to re-enter Greece soon "with Russian aid."
Greece holds a temporary advantage at the frontier. The commission warned, however, of "increased gravity of the threat to peace" if Greece's Communist northern neighbors, Albania and Bulgaria, continue aiding guerrillas in defiance of U.N. Assembly resolutions.
The commission concentrated the weight of its criticism on Albania, asking the general assembly to find Albania "primarily responsible for the threat to peace in the Balkans."
Greece last week threatened to send her troops across the Albanian border unless that Soviet satellite stopped helping guerrillas. The Greek government said then it would notify the U.N. that it felt entitled to do so under Article 51 of the United Nations charter, which outlines measures a nation may take in self-defense.

President Truman will broadcast a special message in observance of the day. It will be heard over ABC and CBS stations from 3 to 3:15 p. m., eastern standard time, as he speaks from Washington. Re-broadcasts over the Mutual network will be heard from 5:30 to 5:45 p. m., eastern standard time.

U. S. Millionaire Ends Self-Exile Of 27 Years
BOSTON, Sept. 22—(AP)—Henry M. Blackmer, 80, Colorado millionaire who fled this country 27 years ago to escape testifying in the Teapot Dome scandal, arrived here Wednesday by plane from France, immigration officials reported.
Blackmer, after gaining great wealth in Colorado mining and western oil ventures, chose self-imposed exile in France rather than testify in the Senate investigations and federal court trials growing out of the oil scandals of the Harding administration.
Subsequently, Blackmer paid \$60,000 in fines for contempt of court and \$3,670.78 for back income taxes.
But he stayed in Europe—protected by the French courts which refused to turn him over to this country.

Highway Association To Meet At Grants Pass
County officials and other local members of the Oregon U.S. 99 Highway association are planning to attend the luncheon and regional meeting to be held at Grants Pass at noon Tuesday, Sept. 27.
H. E. Roadman, Roseburg, president of the association, said highway commissions of Washington, Oregon, and California, and the U. S. Bureau of Public Roads have been invited to be represented.
Speakers at the meeting will include R. H. Baldock, Oregon State Highway department engineer, and State Representative Ralph Moore of Coos Bay, chairman of the interim highway committee.

Russia Issues Warning
The Greek action drew an adverse reaction in Moscow, which although it has no military alliance with Albania, regards itself as a protector of the satellite. The Soviet press warned that the invasion of Albania by Greece would be serious repercussions. U. S. Secretary of State Acheson and British Foreign Secretary Bevin also poured cold water on the Greek plan by announcing they could not go along with it.
The commission also recommended that the assembly again ask Albania and Bulgaria to stop aiding the Greek rebels and call on Albania, Bulgaria and Yugoslavia to cooperate "with an appropriate international body" for observation of whether the guerrillas who fled north had been disarmed and interned.
The Soviet satellites have refused from the beginning to cooperate with the U. N. commission and its observers.
