BUDAPEST, Hungary, Sept. 23.—(AP)—Former Foreign Minister Laszlo Rajk and his seven co-defendants virtually placed the noose around their own necks Thursday. They abjectly confessed again to treason against Hungary's communist-led government.

Meat Prices Drop As Public Turns To Other Needs

(By The Associated Press) Meat prices leveled off this week in many market centers after rising for several weeks.

The slowdown in the advance was largely unexplained, but some trade sources said consumer demand was dwindling because of the high level of prices.

Furthermore, authorities in the meat industry believe meat will get increasing competition the remainder of this year from other commodities like television sets, automobiles and housing.

The first sign of the Thanksgiving holiday season appeared this week—cranberries are back. The housewife isn't much in the mood for them, dealers report, and the demand is light.

The outlook for Florida citrus fruit is not too good from the standpoint of the housewife. Something like one-third of the grapefruit crop was lost in the recent hurricane.

Oranges are in a little better supply position, having lost about 5 per cent in the hurricane. While more oranges will be available for the market, makers of juice concentrates are planning to take a larger share than ever before.

House Probe Ended By Union Pressure, Claim

WASHINGTON, Sept. 23.—(AP)—Rep. Jacobs (D-Ind.) said Thursday a House labor committee investigation of trade union practices was called off because of "heat" brought by the International Pressmen's union on Chairman Lesinski (D-Mich.).

Jacobs was chairman of an investigating subcommittee. Lesinski, as chairman of the full committee, abolished it and other subcommittees last month.

One subject of the subcommittee's inquiry into union democracy was the tangled financial affairs of the late George Berry, president of the AFL Pressmen's union.

Remains of St. Peter Found in Roman Tomb

SOUTHAMPTON, England, Sept. 23.—(AP)—The Roman Catholic archbishop of New Orleans said here the remains of St. Peter have "definitely" been found in a tomb in the St. Peter's basilica in Rome.

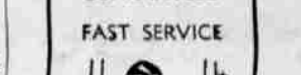

PORTLAND, Sept. 22.—(AP)—AFL Sawmill and Lumber workers say they will resist any move to tie vacation benefits in their next contract to the number of actual days worked.

Members of the Puget Sound district council have authorized the union's executive board to call a strike if necessary to hold existing working conditions and resist any downward revision of wages.

After reading a statement from W. A. Durham, operators' spokesman, union Secretary Kenneth Davis said it "dodges the issue."
