\$100 Million Approved For Public Projects

WASHINGTON, Sept. 24—(P)— The Senate has approved a \$100,000,000 program for planning pub-lic works projects all over the country.

The bill, which has been called

an "anti-depression measure" in Congress, was passed yesterday by voice vote. It now goes to the House.

It would make federal funds available to states and communities for advance planning of needed public works projects. President Truman recommended such a program last July, as a safeguard "If the business downturn should become more serious."


