Bible Academy At Canyonville Has Record Roster

The Canyonville Bible academy has 136 students enrolled this year, the highest in the history of the school. There are 29 seniors, 34 juniors, 38 sophomores, and 35 freshmen. The students come from nine states and two territories. California is first with 59; Oregon and Washington next with 39 and 21, respectively.

The C. B. A. is a four-year high school with some Bible training in addition to regular courses. Music, drama and construction courses are also taught.

Teachers this year are: Howard Haymes, Canyonville, history; Mrs. Howard Haymes, home economics and commercial subjects; W. C. McQueen, Fort Worth, Texas, science and history, dean of boys; Miss Adena Seguire, Toledo, O., music director; Miss Elsie Munding, Canton, Ill., English; Miss Hunt, South Gate, Calif., mathematics; Mrs. Frank Lunbar, Canyonville, Spanish and speech; Miss Mary Berry, dietitian.

Robert Shaffer, secretary for the school, reports the school now has five buildings with an estimated valuation of a quarter-million dollars, including property, buildings and equipment.

Under construction is a new building for classrooms which will accommodate about 150 students. The building is expected to be ready for use about the first of the year. A bridge is also under construction, connecting the C. B. A. property on both side of Canyon creek. Here is located the school ball park. The school has plans to build dormitories which will house about 100 boys. A gymnasium to be built on these grounds is another plan for the future.

The all-modern PX building is an added feature at C. B. A. This year it has a 30-stool counter. Shaffer reports all profits derived from the PX will go into the building program for the betterment of the school.
