Superintendent Paul S. Elliott said bids were opened Friday and taken under advisement by the board, Basic bids were for a shell-type structure. Three al-ternates were included which would allow for a complete build-

The following bids, listing the basic and the total with alternates included, were: Todd Building Co., Roseburg, S62,500-\$116.

436; Industrial Building, Eugene, S62,800; Setiergren-Wiley, Ashland, S69,716-\$116,230; H. J. Settergren, Portland, \$70,200-\$117,000; H. Barnhard, Medford, \$89,322-\$138,534.

Plans for the work were prepared by Portland Architects Freeman, Hayslip & Tuft.

Plans called for a basement of concrete construction to house girls' and boys' locker rooms and showers, storage room, kitchen and teachers' lunch and cafeteria rooms.

The gym playing floor, stage and dressing rooms would be located on the ground level. The floor was to have a plywood finish and the roof will be of bow

ish and the root will be of solid string truss construction. Pipe columns and beams were planned in the floor.

Interior construction generally was to be plastered walls and fiberboard ceilings. Unit heaters were specified, also glass block windows.
