## Fruit Pie DeLuxe Has Pecans In It

Peach Pecan Pie
(5 to 6 servings)
Crust: One cup sifted flour, i teaspoon baking powder, i teaspoon salt. 1/3 cup shortening, 2 to 3 tablespoons ice water.
Sift together I cup sifted flour, the baking powder and i teaspoon salt. Cut in shortening with fork or pastry blender until it is the size of peas. Add ice water a little at a time, mixing only enough to hold ingredients together. Place dough on lightly floured board and roll to about 1/8 inch thickness. Line a 9-inch heat-resistant glass pie plate.
Filling: One cup sugar, 3 tablespoons flour, 2 tablespoons cornstarch, 1/8 teaspoon butter or for-lified margarine, 1 tablespoon grated orange rind, i cup chopped pecans, 2 cups sliced peaches (canned or cooked).
Mix together sugar, 3 tablespoons flour, cornstarch, 1/8 teaspoon salt, cold water, orange juice and butter or margarine; cook for about 15 minutes or until mixture is thick, stirring constantly. Remove from heat

cook for about 15 minutes or until mixture is thick, stirring constantly. Remove from heat and stir in grated orange rind, pecans and sliced peaches. Pour filling into unbaked pastry shell. Bake in moderate oven (375 de-grees F.) for about 40 minutes or until done. or until done

Topping: One-half cup cream, whipped. Garnish with whipped cream for serving.
