Senate Votes Aid For Republic Of Korea

WASHINGTON, Oct. 13—(AP)—The Senate Wednesday passed, 48 to 13, an administration bill authorizing \$150,000,000 for economic aid to the Republic of Korea.

Approval came quickly after chairman Connally (D-Tex.) of the Foreign Relations committee urged it in the interest of "economic and political stability" of the new republic and of the security of the U.S.

Senators Knowland (R-Calif.) and Lodge (R-Mass.) also spoke briefly for the measure.

The bill sets up a "little Marshall Plan" for southern Korea as distinguished from the northern part dominated by Russia.

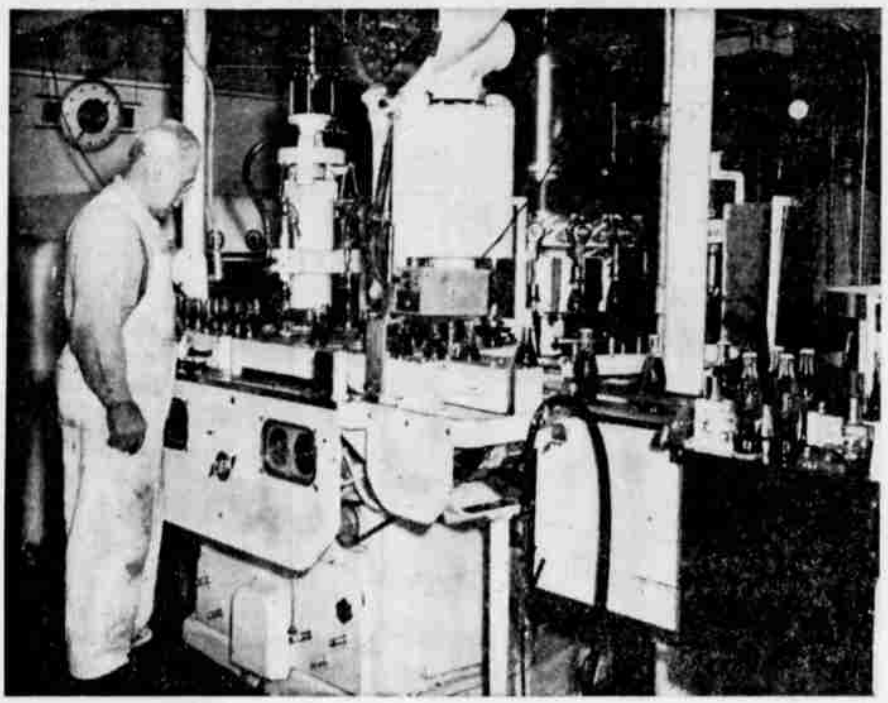
