WASHINGTON, Oct. 13—(4)— The Senate Wednesday passed. 48 to 13, an administration bill authorizing \$150,000,000 for eco-nomic aid to the Republic of Ko-

Approval came quickly after chairman Connally (D-Tex) of the Foreign Relations committee urg-ed it in the interest of "economic and political stability" of the new republic and of the security of the U.S.

Senators Knowland (R-Calif) and Lodge (R-Mass) also spoke briefly for the measure.

The bill sets up a "little Mar-shall Plan" for southern Korea as distinbuished from the north-ern part dominated by Russia.




