Catholic Priests Go Underground in China
VATICAN CITY, Oct. 14.—(P)—Disguised as peddlers, merchants and tradesmen, Catholic priests are reported to have gone underground in communist-occupied China in efforts to carry on missionary work.

Hong Kong reports to the Vatican say that missionaries work under increasing difficulties and restrictions, especially in provincial towns and country areas. There is toleration in Peking and Tientsin, "but outside these cities," the reports said, "there is little or no religious freedom." One priest was forced to work in the fields for 15 days to make up time that authorities claimed he had squandered.

Evangelist To Exhibit Collection Of Stones
An unusual display will be shown at the Glide Baptist church Sunday evening, when Pat Malone, evangelist and lecturer, will present his "Heavenly Stones." The display consists of half a ton of stones gathered from mines and deserts. When mounted, the display measures nine feet high and 12 feet wide and takes three hours to assemble. The rocks glow forth in various colors when auditorium lights are darkened. The impressive collection has been shown in many of the nation's larger cities and is believed to be the only traveling exhibit of its kind in existence.

Peace Prize Winner Says Food Needed To Ban War
DUNDEE, Scotland, Oct. 14.—(P)—Lord Boyd Orr says he will use the money from the 1949 Nobel peace prize, nearly \$22,000, to promote peace and world government.

"The important thing in the world today is to get the nations to cooperate," he said last night. Boyd Orr, a Scotsman, believes wars can be prevented by creation of a world federal government and by raising more food to prevent hunger.

The Norwegian parliament's Nobel committee announced the award Wednesday. Boyd Orr is a food expert and practical farmer. He formerly headed the United Nations food and agricultural organization.

The prize, awarded from a fund set up in 1896 by Alfred B. Nobel, the inventor of dynamite, amounts to 156,289.82 Norwegian kroner (\$21,889.50). It is awarded to persons deemed outstanding in promoting peace among nations.

The Nobel committee does not give reasons for its awards but the 69-year-old recipient said he believed the prize was given him for his proposals for a world food plan as well as for his work for a world federal government.
