

**Plane Crash Kills Two Officers; Wave Saved**

DALTON, Ga., Oct. 21.—(AP)—Attempting an emergency landing on a hastily-lighted football field, a small Navy plane crashed into a cemetery Wednesday night, exploded and burned. Two reserve officers were killed and a Wave was seriously injured. Volunteers snatched the Wave from the flaming wreckage while firemen tried to extinguish the blaze. The Wave, identified as Mary Goldstein of Glen View, Ill., was reported in critical condition at a hospital. The Atlanta Naval Air station listed the dead as Ensign Ralph Meeks Jr., the pilot, and Commander C. Ross Klester, both of Atlanta. They were reservists.

**Yugoslavia Wins Seat On U. N. Security Council**

NEW YORK, Oct. 21.—(AP)—Yugoslavia won a seat in the United Nations Security Council Thursday over the Soviet-sponsored Czechoslovakia. The action by the 59-nation general assembly was a rebuff to the Cominform Soviet bloc.

The vote on the second ballot was Yugoslavia 39 and Czechoslovakia 19. Thirty-nine votes were required for election. Yugoslavia thus squeezed by one the minimum number of votes needed.

The voting was by secret ballot. The United States supported Yugoslavia for the council seat now held by the Soviet Ukraine. The seating changes Dec. 31.

**Portland Freezes City Payroll Minimum**

PORTLAND, Oct. 21.—(AP)—City councilmen have voted to make city employees' present gross pay a minimum in a new salary ordinance.

The vote was to include an \$85 cost-of-living bonus in the new base pay schedules. This would freeze the minimum city payroll at nearly \$800,000 a month.

**Spending Of All Money Voted By Congress Means Deficit Of \$5 Billion For Fiscal Year**

WASHINGTON, Oct. 20.—(AP)—If the government spends all the money the 81st Congress has provided, it may run about \$5,000,000,000 in the red this fiscal year.

The federal financial picture for the fiscal year, which ends next June 30, looks like this:

1. Direct appropriations by Congress, \$37,682,102,989, in addition to indefinite funds, such as interest on the national debt, which are estimated to boost the aggregate to something over \$45,000,000,000. The indefinite items are those over which Congress and the president have little control.
2. Anticipated federal revenues for the year, approximately \$40,000,000,000.
3. Excess of outgo over intake, approximately \$5,000,000,000.

The direct appropriations do not include additional billions in contract authority voted by Congress.

This is a go-ahead which Congress gives the federal departments to contract for expenditures with the understanding Congress will put up the money in another year, or later, as needed. The president's budget called for an estimated \$4,000,000,000 in such authority. Congress voted \$4,500,000,000.

Senator Ferguson (R-Mich) told the Senate that Congress this year has approved government spending of \$30,991,449,997. He included in this total the direct appropriations, the indefinite funds such as interest on the debt, and contract authority.

Congress voted less in direct appropriations than the President requested, but it ignored his tax-increase recommendations. The president said at the start of the session that a deficit would result if Congress didn't do something to get more revenue.

Mr. Truman called repeatedly earlier this year for a \$4,000,000,000 tax boost, mainly on corporation and high bracket personal incomes. But in July, after a business turnaround, he suddenly abandoned his tax demand in favor of in-the-red financing.

In direct appropriations, the president asked for \$39,492,742,830, or \$1,809,539,941 more than Congress gave him.

**Cure For Seasickness Found In Dramamine Pills**

SEATTLE, Oct. 21.—(AP)—Been delaying that ocean excursion because of seasickness? Well, forget it. Military authorities said yesterday they can cure 95 out of 100 cases with dramamine pills.

The Seattle port of embarkation said the tests were made at the request of the army surgeon general on 600 green-at-the-gills passengers on six ships on Alaska and Japan runs.

Half of the sick passengers were given the yellow dramamine pills. The others were given a sugar-and-starch pill which they thought was dramamine. Within an hour or less, 95 per cent of those receiving dramamine said they felt better. Fifty-seven per cent of those getting the sugar-and-starch pill also said they felt better, a reaction taken by the SPE to indicate that a cure can be psychological in many cases. Those getting no relief from the sugar-and-starch pill were later given dramamine, and 96 per cent of this group then reported themselves cured.
