

**Registration Open To Retirement System Kicks**

An invitation has been issued to all teachers and other public employees to register complaints and give comment and criticism on the present Public Employees Retirement system, according to W. D. Bollman, city recorder.

Bollman was recently appointed to serve on the public employees retirement committee of the Oregon Finance Officers Association, according to J. O. Bredemeier, OFOA president.

As part of his duties, Bollman will interview all persons affected by the retirement system, in order to prepare a report for submission to the finance officers before their next annual session.

Other duties will include a review of operation of the present state retirement act and contacting other interest groups.

**Alaska Salmon Pack Up But Dollar Value Down**

SEATTLE —(AP)—Alaska's 1949 salmon pack is reported at the highest figure since 1944, but the dollar value was off 17 percent from last year's record high.

The U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service reported the pack at 4,375,549 last year.

The value was computed at approximately \$80,000,000 compared with last year's record \$96,000,000. The value estimate is on the basis of price to jobbers as listed by the salmon brokerage firm of E. B. McGovern and McGovern.

McGovern cited two reasons for the drop in total value for the bigger pack: (1) General reduction in salmon prices; for example pinks were \$23 to \$24 a case a year ago and \$16 this year; and (2) A sharp reduction in the pack of high priced red salmon and an increase in the lower priced pink.
