**Britain Protests Talk Of U. S. Commissioner**  
LONDON, Oct. 26.—Britain has protested to the United States that statements made by High Commissioner John J. McCloy are seriously harming western policies in Germany.

Diplomatic officials who reported this today said McCloy is going back to Washington early next week for special talks with Secretary of State Acheson.

In Washington, government officials reported the British are "annoyed" at McCloy's recent remarks on dismantling of German plants. However, they pictured it as a "tempest in a teapot" and predicted the affair will be straightened out amicably.
