Ninth Teen-Age Boy Arrested in Series Of Thefts

PORT ORCHARD, Wash., Oct. 28.—(AP)—Sheriff Dean D. Jones said Wednesday a 15-year-old boy had admitted an armed holdup of a Hood canal inn with another youth.

The boy's arrest brought to nine the number of teen-agers under arrest in connection with a series of burglaries and other crimes in Kitsap and Mason counties.

The sheriff said another admitted burglary by members of the group ran the total to nine burglaries and four automobile thefts. The burglary loot was listed at \$613 in cash, plus clothing and beer.

Jones said the newly arrested 15-year-old told of participating with an 18-year-old in the armed holdup of Robin Hood Inn on Hood canal near the night closing hour Sept. 25. They got about \$160 from the cash register and \$60 from patrons.

The sheriff said the boy related how both of them were armed with Luger pistols, which they had stolen from a friend. They later abandoned the weapons in a Bremerton theater.

The boy explained that they did not want to throw them away because they belonged to the friend. They left the pistols in the theater in the hope they would be returned to the owner.

The 18-year-old named by the boy as an accomplice was among the group of boys arrested earlier. The sheriff withheld all names explaining that such a policy was advisable while the investigation is continuing.

The sheriff said all of the boys under arrest had admitted participating in one or more of the series of offenses. He said several of them admitted knowing that the two boys had the Luger pistols, but denied knowing what they were doing with them.

LOS ANGELES, Oct. 28.—(AP)—Leslie Jahn, 41-year-old tennis coach, Wednesday was convicted on three counts of incest involving his 16-year-old daughter, Laura Lou Jahn, former national junior girls' tennis champion. Superior Judge William Byrne gave the verdict after hearing two days of testimony in the case tried without a jury. Jahn faces a possible penalty of one to 50 years imprisonment on each count.

Denfeld Ouster Plan Stirs Fuss

WASHINGTON, Oct. 28.—(AP)—Plans for a 35,000-man cut in the navy were disclosed Thursday in the midst of a growing storm over reports that Admiral Louis E. Denfeld will be ousted as chief of naval operations. Rep. Arends (R-Ill.) said he had been informed that Denfeld will be asked to resign in the "next day or two" because of testimony he gave the House armed services committee on differences in the armed services. Arends demanded in a statement that the committee convene to meet this "insult to Congress." He said the committee had promised Denfeld and other critics that they could speak their minds freely without fear of retaliation. Arends said Congress for its own protection must fight an ouster of Denfeld. He said no congressional committee in the future would be able to get testimony "worth a pinch of salt" from officers of the armed services if Denfeld is to get the axe.

Morals Charge Jails Tennile Resident

The county jail population was swelled by the addition of six persons Thursday, according to Sheriff O. T. "Bud" Carter. Francis Joe Evans, 23, Tennile, arrested by Roseburg city police, has been booked on a charge of contributing to the delinquency of a minor, reported Carter. Five others, arrested by Oakland City police, on vagrancy charges, have been sentenced to 15 days each upon arraignment in the court of Justice of Peace A. J. Geddes. They include Elbert Edward Davis, 21, Williamsport, Ind.; Charley Garza, 24, Slaton, Tex.; Ricardo Perez, 27, Havana, Cuba; Jesus Arocha Delgado Jr., 31, Los Angeles, and Allen Wayne Kaufman, 19, Dallas, Ore.

Mother Follows Son As Polio Patient

BOISE, Idaho, Oct. 28.—(AP)—Just two weeks after her son was flown from Lewiston to Boise as an emergency polio patient, Mrs. Edna Klappenbach made the same trip—also as a polio patient. Les Randolph of Boise piloted the plane on both emergency trips. Mrs. Klappenbach was admitted to St. Alphonsus hospital's polio isolation ward. Her son, Darle, was transferred from the isolation ward to the Elks convalescent home a few days ago.
