

Nourse's Warning On Finances Food For Serious Thought By Americans



While his remarks are being interpreted as an attack upon the Truman administration, Nourse made plain he did not intend them as such He wished to spare no one—neither government nor business, labor or farmers. He housed on succement for

It is a very delicate task to develop needed security meas-ures and still maintain the eco-nomy in its full productive vigor. Yet if due thought is not given to the country's basic economic health, security programs will become pointies. We find it increasingly tire-some that those who do not un-derstand the relation between productive wealth and security should see fit to attack as un-progressive everyone who does appreciate the connection. He caution-ed against "monetary and fiscal tricks" which he termed a "slip-pery road to misery."
