





Chinese Reds May Try To Spread Ism By Invasion Of Neighbor Countries

The sweeping success of the Communist armies in China has set the chancelleries of the western world to pondering whether the victorious forces are likely to halt at China's frontiers or whether they may try to spread the red ism by invasion of neighboring

Secretary of State Acheson has expressed concurn that the Reds might strike beyond China. However, many diplomats take the view that the Communists twon't invade other nations militarily but will depend on fifth column offensives, with perhaps later infiltration by guerrillas.

Whatever may be the procedure, of this I think we may be sure: Mowcow is bound to take advantage of the Communist success in China to try to spread Bolshevism throughout the Far East.

Naturally thoughts immediately turn to Burma and to the Indian peninsula, which comprises the nations of India and Pakistan. This vast territory contains more than 400,000,000 people—close to a fifth of the globe's population.

The Chinese Nationalists still hold that part of Western China diolining Burma. 
