Veal Balls Fancy Dish For Sunday

Here's a delectable meat dish to make Sunday's dinner particularly welcome:

Veal Balls in Mushroom Sauce
Cream Sauce (4 servings)

One pound chopped veal, 1 clove garlic, minced, 1 teaspoon salt, 1-16 teaspoon pepper, 1-4 cup milk, 1 egg, beaten, 1-2 cup fine bread crumbs, 1-4 cup fat, 1-2 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce, 2 tablespoons flour, one 3-ounce can boiled-in-butter whole mushroom crowns, 1-2 cups sour cream.

Melt fat in frying pan over moderate heat, add Worcestershire sauce. Brown patties on both sides. Remove patties. Strain in flour. Add mushroom broth, mushrooms, quartered, and sour cream. Cook, stirring constantly, until sauce thickens and boils. Add veal patties. Cover and heat over low heat until thoroughly hot, about 20 minutes. Serve if tossed with poppy seeds.

For dessert, serve a warm orange-apple deep dish pie.

Deep-Dish Orange Apple Pie
(Serves 4-6)

Two tablespoons flour, 1-2 cup sugar, 1-4 teaspoon nutmeg, 1-4 teaspoon salt, 1-2 teaspoon cinnamon, 1 cup orange juice, 2 tablespoons lemon juice, 2 tablespoons butter or fortified margarine, 1 teaspoon grated lemon rind, 7 cups sliced, quartered, pared, cored apples, 1-4-inch thick, pastry for 1-crust pie.

Combine first 7 ingredients; simmer, stirring until thickened. Remove from heat; add butter any lemon rind. Arrange apples in a greased 10x5x2-inch baking dish; pour sauce over them; toss well. Roll pastry large enough to allow 1-2-inch overhanging edge all around. Cut slits in center of

pastry to allow steam to escape. Lay pastry loosely over apples; fold overhanging edge onto rim of baking dish, and press edges down firmly with upturned tines of floured fork. Brush with top milk. Chill until ready to bake. Bake in hot oven (425 degrees F.) 40 minutes. Serve warm.

Softened gelatine in cold water. Add hot water, salt and sugar and stir until dissolved. Stir in vinegar and lemon juice. Chill until mixture is consistency of unbeaten egg whites. Stir in the onion and mixed vegetables. Turn into large or individual molds and chill until firm. Unmold and serve on salad greens with French dressing.
