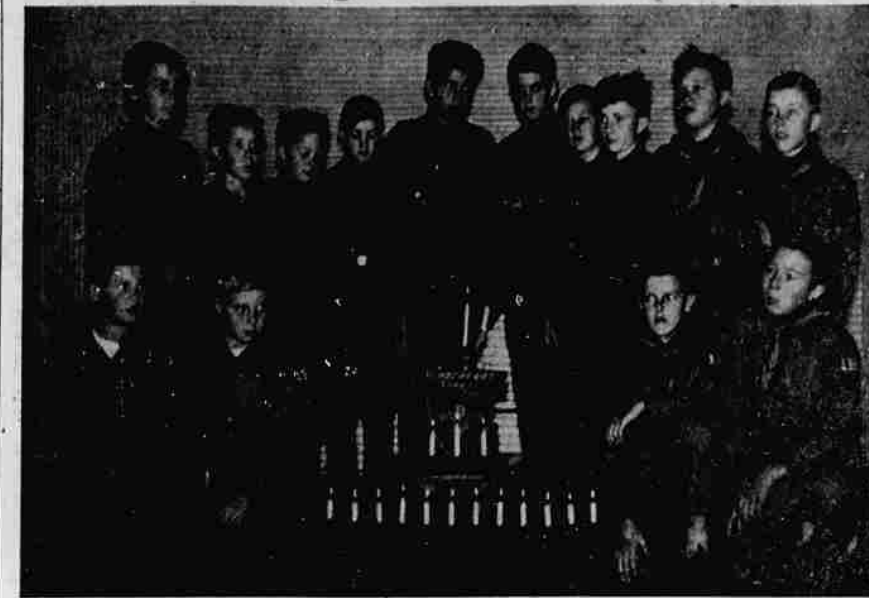

Grounded Yacht Likely Total Loss

ACAPULCO, Mexico, Nov. 14.—(AP)—The costly yacht "Corsair," beached on the rocks here, fell over on her right side overnight.

Once the late J. P. Morgan's \$3,000,000 pleasure craft, the 2,699-ton yacht looks to seamen more than ever like a total loss. Salvage experts and insurance appraisers are coming from Los Angeles to see what can be done.

Captain of the Port meantime continued today his hearing of officers and crew. He is trying to determine responsibility, if any, for the harbor shipwreck Saturday at 12:20 a.m. as the boat was starting on her return to Los Angeles with 46 passengers and 82 crew.

Both the captain of the Port and the ship's captain, H. Needen, agreed the steering mechanism failed. The ship struck rocks within a mile of the Acapulco dock.
