The deadline for filing returns is April 15. Under the old system, if you got an extension of time, all you had to pay was interest.

Now, if you get an extension up to three months, y(t) will have to pay at least 25 percent of your tax. And if the extension is from three to six months, you'll have to pay half of the tax. These partial payments will be due at the time the extension is grant-

states.


Mr. Truman urged them to use "boldness and imagination" in meeting the region's problems.
