NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the undersigned will up to 7:30 o'clock P. M. of the 23rd day of December, 1949, receive sealed bids for the purchase of negotiable serial coupon bonds of School District No. 71, Douglas County, Oregon, in the sum of \$65,000, said bonds to be denominated in \$1,000 each, all dated January 1, 1950, and maturing the first five (5) bonds in equal amounts on the 1st day of January, 1952, and five (5) succeeding bonds in number on the 1st day of January of each year thereafter up to and including the 1st day of January, 1964. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on the 23rd day of November, 1949, a special election will be held at the City Hall in the City of Oakland, Oregon, between the hours of 8 o'clock A. M. and 8 o'clock P. M. of said day, at which election there will be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Oakland for adoption or rejection, the following proposed amendment to the existing charter of the City of Oakland, to-wit:

AN ACT to amend the existing City Charter of the City of Oakland, Oregon by adding thereto subdivision 33 to Section 2, Article 4, authorizing and empowering the Common Council of the City of Oakland to construct a city municipal building to house the city offices, library, fire hall and jail and to purchase street maintenance equipment; authorizing the Common Council of said city to issue and sell bonds of said city in a sum not to exceed \$2,000.00 for the purpose of providing the necessary funds to construct said building and to purchase street maintenance equipment; provide for the levying of taxes to pay the interest on said bonds and to pay said bonds at maturity.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF OAKLAND

That section 2, Article 4 of the existing municipal charter of the City of Oakland, Oregon as enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon, and as heretofore amended by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon, and as heretofore amended by vote of the people of the City of Oakland, Oregon under the initiative and referendum, shall be and the same hereby is amended by adding thereto subdivision 33 to Section 2, Article 4 of the Charter of the City of Oakland, Oregon as follows: "33 That the Common Council of the City of Oakland, Oregon is hereby authorized to construct a municipal building to house the city offices, library, firehall and city jail and to purchase street maintenance equipment in such manner as to the common council may seem advisable. For the purpose of raising the necessary funds to construct said municipal building and to purchase street maintenance equipment the Common Council is authorized and empowered to issue and sell bonds of the City of Oakland, Oregon bearing interest not to exceed 4 1/2% per annum and in an amount not to exceed \$2,000.00. The bonds hereby authorized shall be in such sums and in such denominations and shall be payable in principal at such time or times as the common Council may determine, such time not to exceed twenty (20) years. All bonds hereunder shall be deemed as current and shall have priority as to each other and shall be designated as general improvement bonds of the City of Oakland. The Common Council is hereby authorized and directed to levy a tax annually in addition to all other taxes authorized by the Charter to pay the interest on said bonds and to provide a sinking fund for the payment of said bonds at maturity and to pay said bonds at any time thereafter authorized. The indebtedness authorized by this charter amendment is in addition to all other indebtedness of said city already incurred or authorized and is not to be considered as affected by any limit of indebtedness in said Charter."

The form of ballot at said election will be as follows: OFFICIAL BALLOT CITY OF OAKLAND SPECIAL ELECTION OF NOVEMBER 23, 1949. CHARTER AMENDMENT SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS BY THE CITY COUNCIL. Shall Section 2, Article 4 of the existing Charter of the City of Oakland, Oregon be amended by adding thereto subdivision 33, authorizing the Common Council to construct a City Municipal Building to house city offices, library, city jail and fire hall and to purchase street maintenance equipment; authorizing the Common Council to issue and sell not to exceed \$2,000.00 general obligation bonds to bear interest not to exceed 4 1/2% per annum in such form and denominations and payable at such time or times as the Council may determine, not to exceed 20 years, and to levy an annual tax to provide for payment of interest and principal and provide sinking fund therefor.

Court Bans Press Article On Housing

PASCO, Wash., Nov. 21. — (AP) — Publisher Glenn Lee of the Tri-City Herald had a flock of telegrams and telephone calls over the weekend but no comment on a court restraining order preventing the publishing of an article dealing with a nearby low-cost housing project.

Lee said he would withhold comment until after a court hearing tomorrow. The order was issued Friday. A construction company charged the article, the last of a series of four, might have an adverse effect on a pending court action. The firm has brought a \$100,000 damage suit against the Herald for the article on the project already printed. The articles, the company charged, contained "untrue and damaging statements."

Tangible Progress Made In Stemming Soviets

CHATTANOOGA. — (AP) — Assistant Secretary of State George C. McGhee said that "tangible progress" has been made "in stemming the Soviet tide." He added, however, that the conflict between East and West "is drawing heavily upon our material resources" and he cautioned: "There is no cause for complacency, and there can be no relaxation of vigilance." He addressed the National Convention of Young Democratic Clubs.

In a telegram to Lee, the American Society of Newspaper Editors said the case set a "highly dangerous precedent of restraining before publication." The wire was signed by B. M. McKelway, president of the society and executive editor of the Washington Star.

Washington University Will Enlarge Stadium

SEATTLE. — (AP) — University of Washington reports have approved the construction of additions to the stadium and the Student Union building. The approval is subject to bids being within the \$3,000,000 to be available. The board authorized drafting of plans for a \$2,500,000 bond issue. There is \$500,000 available from university funds for the Union building. Each project is estimated to cost \$1,500,000.

A call for bids was authorized for the stadium addition. It will increase the seating capacity to 35,000 from the present 40,000. More than 20,000 seats would be under cover. The addition will be a covered upper-deck grandstand over part of the south side of the stadium.
