

Atomic Energy For Industry Use

Slowed By Threat
SEATTLE—(A)—Sen. McMahon
(D-Conn) said here development
of atomic power for industrial
and commercial use would
"spurt ahead" if atomic weapons
were outlawed.

McMahon, chairman of the
joint Congressional Atomic Energy committee spoke before an
open meeting sponsored by the
King County Central Democratic
committee.

The Connecticut senator addeed, however, that the United States must keep its stockpile of atomic bombs until Russia agrees "to a realisite system of international atomic control."

McMahon said there appeared little hope for such an agreement because it would mean an end to the Iron Curtain.

"Atomic energy control is the heart of the question of peace," the senator said, "There can be no stability or peace in the world as long as there is an atomic race between Russia and the United States."

McMahon said he personally is convinced the Russians are making atomic bombs. He asserted the United States would be much more vulnerable to an atomic weapon attack than Russia because of the large concentration of population and indus-

LOS ANGELES, - (A) -Siamese twin girls born here six months ago, are "doing all

months ago, are "doing all right," general hospital reported. The bables weighed about 11 pounds together at birth and now tweight 19 pounds, four ounces. They are joined at the top of their heads and lie in nearly opposite directions in a crib. A hospital spokesman said they will astay there indefinitely because home care would be an almost impossible task for the mother, a Mrs. John Jones, a Negro who has seven other children.

Dr. Phoebus Berman, medical director of the hospital, said it is felt surgery would be to drastic, at least while the bables are infants.

TOFIELD, Alta., —(CP)—Siamese twin girls, born to Mrs. Bud Townsend, 20, in the Tofield Municipal hospital were reported to be "doing fine."

The bables, weighing a total of nine pounds 12 ounces, were born Nov. 17.
