

Poles and French Grab Nationals Of Each Other

WARSAW, Poland, Nov. 22.—(P)—More than 100 persons have been arrested as members of a spy ring which Polish authorities say was linked with the French embassy here.

An alleged confession by Andre Simon Robineau, secretary of the French consulate at Szczecin (Stettin), Poland, was said by a spokesman of the foreign ministry here to have led to "liquidation" of the spy ring.

Robineau was arrested at the Warsaw airport last Friday as he was about to board a plane for Paris for a vacation.

"Certain threads have led out authorities to one of the foreign embassies in Warsaw," said Gen. Grosz, chief spokesman for the Polish foreign ministry. Grosz told newsmen Robineau "admitted espionage and revealed that his position in the French consulate served as a cover for these activities."

Foreign correspondents heard part of the wire recordings said to be Robineau's confession and were shown photostatic copies of documents allegedly signed by him.

Other Frenchmen Missing

(In Paris the French foreign ministry denied the Polish charges. A spokesman said the French were worried about Robineau because he was not the first Frenchman to have disappeared inside Poland. The spokesman said an employee of the French consulate at Breslau and a French student had been missing for four months and Polish authorities had given only "evasive" answers about their whereabouts.)

Poland has protested both verbally and by diplomatic note arrest in Paris of the Polish plane crew which was to have flown Robineau to Paris last Friday. The crew was arrested when the plane arrived without Robineau and the plane was impounded. Poland demanded the immediate release of both plane and crew, declaring the French action of retaliation was deprived of "all traces of legality."

Sen. Magnuson of Washington thinks it would be well for his state, for Alaska and for U.S.-Canadian joint defense if a railroad were built across western Canada to Alaska. Alaska's Gov. Wool Growers Not Hurt By Devaluation Of Pound

SPOKANE — (P) — The increased use of woolen goods under the devaluation of the English pound should benefit U. S. wool growers, but manufacturers may feel the pinch because of their small profit margin.

That belief was expressed to the 56th annual convention of the Washington Wool Growers' association by Dr. Arthur W. Peterson, an agricultural economist.

Wool growers will not be hurt by the devaluation because they trade on an international market, he said. "United States man-

ufacturers operating with marginal efficiency, and their workers, will be the ones to feel the pinch."

Alan Rogers, Ellensburg cattleman, told delegates he had increased beef production at lower costs by using irrigated pastures. He suggested the sheepmen could obtain the same benefits.
