Little Girl Wanting Career In Wildlife Service Draws Advice From Department Of Interior

WASHINGTON—(P)—Yes, little girl, the United States government is interested in you and your future.
It wants you to get the best education possible, and to find the job for which you're best suited. If home-making is to be your career, it wants to see you happily married.

Take Saralee Levendosku, West Somerville, Mass., for example. She wrote to Secretary of Agriculture Brannan that "although I am only 13, I am very much interested in animals."
"I would like to make my work working with animals, or something to do with them," she said.

"I wonder if there is any work in this field for girls, as I am a girl."
"I have had many discouraging letters, saying that there is no such work for women in this field but I absolutely refuse to give up."

The letter drew a reply from Albert M. Day, director of Interior's Fish and Wildlife Service.
Day wrote Saralee that she should be able to find a place for herself in wildlife work because there is "always a niche for anyone who really knows his or her subject."
"Although there aren't too many women working with wildlife at the present, there will be more in the future," Day said.
He suggested that Saralee might try to become a biologist in wildlife work—or a writer of biological studies, or an information specialist, or an animal
