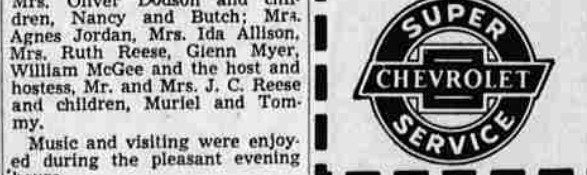
P. W. E. MEMBERS ENTERTAIN FAMILIES AT TURKEY DINNER
