## School Buses in Oregon Inspected Under New Law

More than 1100 Oregon school buses have been checked by state department personnel under the new school bus inspection program set in motion by the last state legislature, Secretary of State Earl T. Newberry reported today.

Initial inspection of the state's estimated total of 1200 buses is expected to be completed by December 30, after which a recheck of older vehicles will begin. The law directed the secretary of state to adopt and enforce mechanical and equipment specifications in line with those recommended nationally. Standards were published and distributed last July and inspections began shortly before the opening of the current school year.

Newberry said buses placed in service for the first time within a school district are required to meet the new standards, while older units continuing in service within a district are inspected for general operational safety.

Installation of stop signal arms, bearing the word "stop" in white reflectorized letters on a red background, will soon be completed on all buses, the secretary reported. The signal arm is displayed while children are crossing the roadway as a reminder to motorists who are stopped for the bus that they must not proceed until the way is clear.

## Jaycees Nominate Officers, Hear Talk By Al Knauss On Community Hospital Plans

Nomination of officers for the coming year and a talk by Al Knauss, Community hospital manager, highlighted a meeting of the Roseburg Junior Chamber of Commerce last night at the Umpqua hotel.

Knauss, who came here from Brooklyn recently explained what the new community hospital will consist of in regards to equipment and other facilities.

The hospital will be open to all persons and to all doctors, and facilities will include a pathological service, pharmacy, x-ray room, a general surgery unit and a special surgery reserved for dental operations and ear, nose and throat surgery, Knauss said.

In addition, a special five-bed children's ward, decorated to please the child, will be included. This will be the only ward unit in the hospital, Knauss said. All other rooms will be private or semi-private, i. e., not more than two beds.

Floor space will equal one acre, or 23,000 square feet, according to the hospital manager. He indicated that in his capacity as manager, he would be the "go-between" between the hospital board, made up of local citizens, and the people. The directors will run the hospital, Knauss said, subject to suggestions from hospital donors. He pointed out that the U. S. government has "the say-so" in hospital matters, but

Knauss sees this as an advantage.

The government helps keep the hospital open to new ideas, the speaker said, adding that more progress has been made in hospitals in the last 25 years than in the previous 100 years, due to government help.

He said several other groups help maintain standards for hospitals throughout the nation, as a protection to the patient. Some of these groups include the American Hospital Association and the American College of Hospital Administrators.

Nominated to office for the coming year were Leo Sevy and George McIntosh, president; Walt Brittle and Gordon Carlson, internal vice-president; Lowell Rhoden, external vice-president; Sid Moon, secretary; Duane Baker, treasurer; Rod Dotson, Harold Chitwood, sergeant-at-arms.

Nominated to the board of directors were Charlie Hart, Irv Pugh, Mel Higge, Don Castel, John Fett, "Whitey" Reitman and Keith Custer.

Eud Parsons, Jaycee basketball coach, pointed out the aims of participation in the YMCA league. He emphasized that exercise is the primary purpose, with winning the ball games a close second. Jaycee basketball candidates will practice tonight at the Junior high school gymnasium, Parsons said, adding that after tonight, practice sessions will be held at the armory. Players were urged by Parsons to hunt up their tennis shoes and turn out for practice tonight.

# KDND DIAL-LOG

The Cinderella theme, rather than the prizes that are awarded, is the "prime factor" responsible for the increasing nationwide popularity of audience-participation programs, Dr. Franklin Fearing, professor of social psychology at the University of California at Los Angeles, has revealed in an official research report.

Dr. Fearing based his report on 1,000 man-hours of research by four of his assistants, who studied 16,000 wishes made by audience participants for Mutual-Don Lee's "Queen" program. Interviews with "Queen" winners, with unsuccessful applicants and with staff personnel who are responsible for the week-day broadcasts revealed, according to Dr. Fearing's report, the following facts:

- Erskine Johnson: 35% wishes for cinderella-type experiences (a date with a movie star, a holiday trip to Bermuda, etc.).
  - 30% ask for household items (washing machines, vacuum cleaners).
  - 18% for special services (jobs, medical attention).
  - 13% for luxury items (characterized by Dr. Fearing as the "loot" motive).
  - 4% for bizarre, or unreasonable, wishes.
- The social psychology professor concluded: "There seems to be an increasing need during these confused times for a belief in this sort of magic."
