Russia "Regrets" Sentry's Killing Of U. S. Soldier

BERLIN, Dec. 2.—(AP)—Maj.
Gen. Maxwell D. Taylor, U. S.
commandant of Berlin, said to-
day the Russians have expressed
regret over the fatal shooting of
a U. S. air force sergeant by a
Soviet sentry last week.

Taylor did not immediately dis-
close details of the note, which
was in reply to his protest against
the shooting. Taylor described
the incident as "brutal" in his
protest and asked assurances that
there would be no recurrence. He
also asked that the sentry be
punished.

Staff Sgt. John E. Staff of
Ramsey, Ill., was fatally wounded
by a Russian sentry Nov. 26,
when he apparently failed to
head a challenge.

A high American official who
declined to be identified de-
scribed the Russian note as "sur-
prisingly conciliatory." He said the
Russian sentry was mentioned by
name, in itself an unusual prac-
tice for the Russians.

He said the note was not quite
an apology in the accepted sense,
but it was "very mild."

The Russian sentry, he said,
told his superiors that he had
challenged the car, that it had
failed to halt while in the Soviet
zone and that he had fired at the
tres.

One shot struck Staff in the
head. He was driving the car.

The American official said a
full investigation had disclosed
these facts:

Staff, two comrades and a Ger-
man girl were riding in an offi-
cial American car which had
been taken out without authoriza-
tion. The men were dressed in
army fatigues. They had entered
the Russian zone, since the Rus-
sian sentry box is some distance
inside the Soviet border.

When they noted the sentry,
Staff turned the car around and
attempted to return.

Neuberger's Plan, CVA, Socialized Medicine Hit

PENDELTON.—(AP)—Political
speakers opposed state Senator
Richard Neuberger's reappoint-
ment plan, socialized medicine,
and CVA at a meeting of Re-
publicans and members of other
parties here Wednesday night.

Mrs. George T. Gerlinger,
Portland, President of the coun-
cil of Oregon Republican Women
said that Eastern Oregon, es-
pecially, would suffer were Neu-
berger's plan adopted.

"Western Oregon, too, would
be hurt by it," she said.
"I agree with the Oregon Voter
which tells of the distortions of
regional relationships."

"We Republicans propose, in-
stead, the 'American Plan,' the
plan of the 'founding fathers.'"
This plan allowed one senator
from each county with represen-
tatives chosen on the basis of po-
pulation.

Filbert Crop Subsidy Payment Scheduled

WASHINGTON.—(AP)—The ag-
riculture department has an-
nounced it will pay a subsidy of
about 5.5 cents a pound to grow-
ers for diverting a part of this
year's west coast filbert crop into
non-commercial uses or foreign
markets.

The department said about 25
per cent of about 3,000,000
pounds of this year's crop is a
surplus above expected market
needs.

The subsidy program is de-
signed to keep this surplus from
being dumped onto the market.

Ditch Company Wins Condemnation Suit

PENDELTON.—(AP)—A federal
court jury has awarded \$15,369
to the Brownell Ditch company,
defendant in a condemnation suit
against the federal government.

The case was concluded late
Wednesday before Judge Claude
McColloch, during the present
Pendleton term of the federal
district court. The sealed jury's
verdict was read at open court
this morning.

The federal government offered
\$369 for the two miles of ir-
rigation ditch it took over for
the McNary dam project. Brown-
ell Ditch company asked \$60,000.

Sen. Morse Answers Phone Queries On Air

EUGENE.—(AP)—Sen. Wayne
Morse engaged in a marathon
radio broadcast Wednesday night
over a local radio station. In a
question and answer program,
the junior senator from Oregon
spoke for one hour and forty-
five minutes, covering a wide
range of subjects.

The program consisted of resi-
dents of the county phoning in
their questions to the radio sta-
tion switchboard, where they
were taken down in shorthand
and then handed to Senator
Morse. He then proceeded to give
his answer over the microphone.
When the program was finally
ended, there were still numerous
questions to be answered.
Observers in the studio were
all exhausted at the end of the
broadcast—some of them being
pressed into service to help han-
dle the phone calls. However, the
senator was fresh as a daisy—
and still willing to talk some-
more, even though he had given
half a dozen speeches before the
broadcast.
