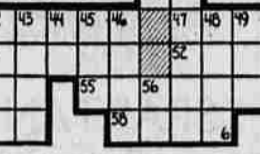

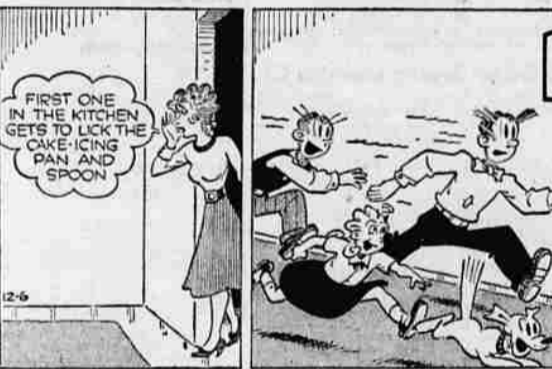

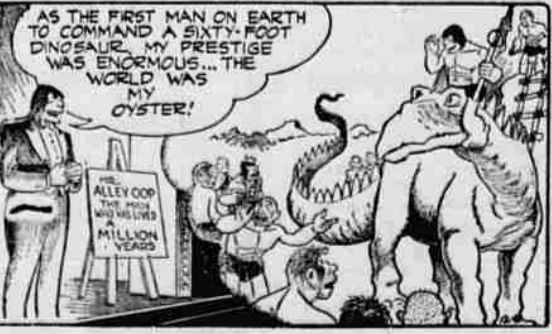

Two Alleged Floggers Freed

ROME, Ga. — (AP) — Two of the 12 defendants in the mass civil rights trial were freed by Federal District Judge Frank A. Hooper.

They were L. C. Spears and Trenton City Recorder John Wilkins. Both were given a directed verdict of "not guilty" on the grounds of insufficient evidence.

They were among the 12 Dade county men accused by the government of conspiracy to violate the civil rights in the mass flogging of seven Negroes last April 2.

Defense attorney Frank Gleason argued that the evidence against all 12 was insufficient to prove conspiracy and that there is no federal law against assault and battery.

Judge Hooper said he could agree with the defense attorney only in the case of Spears and Wilkins.
