

China Policy Of U. S. Scored By Sen. Knowland

HONOLULU, Dec. 7. — (AP) — Senator Knowland (R-Cal) said on his arrival from the east last Monday the U. S. State department was sending a specialist on a slow boat to China when the Nationalists desperately need a blood transfusion.

Knowland, flying in ahead of three colleagues who were rounding out a globe tour, bitterly criticized the State department's China policy.

"Now when minutes, hours and days are of vital importance the State department announces a specialist Dr. Jessup (Philip K.) is waiting until Dec. 20 to take a slow boat to China," Knowland said.

"Perhaps by the time he arrives Great Britain will have completed ground work for another Munich by appeasement of the (Chinese) communists through recognition," he declared.

As a member of the Senate, Knowland said he was "shocked by what has been done in the name of the people of the United States."

"It is clear State department actions are directed now, as in the past few years, toward dividing rather than unifying non-Communist forces in China, including those on the island of Formosa," the Californian continued.

"It has long been Communist doctrine to divide and conquer," he went on, "we should not be undermining our friends by new moves which will tend to divide them in their most critical hours. Despite serious setbacks and regardless of grave errors by the Chinese government and our own, I am convinced that the free, independent and non-Communist government of China will live."

Arriving in another plane Senator Ellender (D-La) said he feared Formosa might fall into the hands of the Chinese Communists and be used as bait against the United States.

(Formosa sits astride the sea and air lanes between the Philippines and Okinawa, the United States' most important base in the orient.)

Ellender said the military situation in China was black.

Shirley Temple Granted Divorce

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 7. — (AP) — Shirley Temple divorced John Agar Monday testifying that her marriage to the handsome actor was turbulent. She accused him of paying too much attention to other women and of drinking too much.

Courtroom spectators gasped when the one-time child star testified that Agar's conduct once forced her to leave their house and consider "driving over a cliff."

She said that when she was five months pregnant Agar brought another woman into her bedroom and urged her to go out to a party.

Frequently, she said, he left her alone in night clubs while he danced with other women and kissed them.

Also, she declared, Agar frequently came home "very drunk," and with lipstick on his face.

Miss Temple, 21, and Agar, 28, were married in Beverly Hills, Calif., Sept. 19, 1945, while Agar was in the air force. It was one of movie land's big romantic events.

They have a daughter, Linda Susan, 22 months.

The couple separated last Oct. 12, the day before she sued for divorce.

Flaming Airplane Carries Five Persons To Death

LONG BEACH, Calif., Dec. 7. — (AP) — Five occupants of a light plane died Monday in a flaming crash, seconds after they took off on a midnight sightseeing flight.

Robert Sanders, 33, operator of a drugstore fountain-grill, was identified as the pilot. A friend, Harry Herbert, 37, said he had been invited on the trip with Sanders and four friends but declined, explaining: "I wouldn't go up in foggy weather like this."

The tower at municipal airport cleared the plane, however, saying visibility was satisfactory.

The other dead were identified by police as Cliff Boyden, 35; Eddie C. Wise, 42; Hal Evans, 22; and John Putnam all of Long Beach.

Girl Relies On God As Medics Try To Save Her Hand

MEMPHIS, Tenn., Dec. 7. — (AP) — Medical science today makes its last try for a while to save the hand of Betty Lou Marbury, whose faith is in the Lord.

The 10-year-old girl gets one more X-Ray treatment here. Then, with Christmas ahead, she returns to her farm home until early next week. That's when a Memphis surgeon will answer the question:

Must her right hand be amputated? Or will science and the prayers of a nation save it—and preserve the simple faith of Betty?

From a medical standpoint there isn't much hope—a malignant infection such as Betty's isn't easy to cure, or stop.

And many of the ministers who have offered prayers have expressed faith that the hand will be saved but have added that sometimes it isn't "God's will" that a certain prayer be granted.

Betty and her parents drove here yesterday from their home near Brownsville, Tenn., 60 miles away, for an X-Ray treatment. They were met by Chaplain

Frederick P. Loman of Baptist hospital, who said a prayer for Betty and then gave her a Bible.

In the same hospital the Memphis and Shelby county Baptist pastors conference offered a special plea for the frail little blonde.

It was six days ago that Betty wrote a letter to the Commercial Appeal. She said she had been told her hand might have to be removed.

She asked the paper's readers to pray that her health might be

Ku Klux Merger Under One Leader Appears Slated

TALLAHASSEE, Fla., Dec. 7. — (AP) — A high Klan spokesman predicted here Monday that all Ku Klux Klansmen soon will be united under one national leader and will carry out a single program.

The prediction was made by William Hendrix, national adjutant of the Southern Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, in announcing that a "working agreement" had been made with the Alabama Klan.

The southern knights of the Ku Klux Klan is an offshoot of the original Southern Klans, Inc. It has units in Florida, South Georgia and South Alabama. For the past few months it has operated as an independent organization.

The agreement with the Alabama Klan is believed to leave only the Klans in North Carolina and South Carolina operating as an individual unit.

Imperial Wizard Samuel Roper of the Associated Klans of America and of the Association of Georgia Klans recently announced a "working agreement" with the federated Klans of Alabama.

The Klan's main purpose, Hendrix said, is to combat Communism.
