## China's Li Arrived in U. S. As Virtual Political Exile

SAN FRANCISCO—(AP)—Li Tsung-jen, acting president of Nationalist China, arrived in the United States as a virtual political exile. The plain fact is that he has no safe place to go back to in China.

Li said upon arrival in San Francisco that his absence from China is only temporary.

Li left again by chartered plane for New York's Presbyterian hospital for treatment of an ulcerated stomach. This treatment is described as his principal reason for being in this country.

Li also plans to talk to American officials—presumably about aid for the Nationalist cause.

He said he "naturally" would pay his respects to President Truman.

President Li, a lean man of medium height, with sparse, graying hair, sparkling eyes and a constant smile, is accompanied by his wife, Madame Li Tsung-jen, and his sons, Li Yau-tuen and Li Jackson, and several aides.

At a public reception here in San Francisco's Chinatown, largest in this country, Li said:

"The communist threat to China and Asia is grave but there is cause for hope. I expect all Chinese will support the Nationalist government. This is not a civil war. It is a war of aggression directed by the third international. We're not only fighting for China. We're fighting a world wide campaign."

### Blames Reds, Leaders

He blamed the present plight of his government on (1) the rise of communism and Russian aid to Chinese communists and (2) the government's past failures to work hard enough for the people's welfare.

A formal statement distributed by Dr. Kan Chieh-hou, his personal representative in Washington, declared the whole Asiatic continent and country beyond was faced with the danger of communist rule should the present conquest go unchecked.

Li assured "our American friends that the Chinese people are determined to preserve their liberty." He declared his absence from China in no way affected the campaign against the communists and "as soon as my physical condition permits... I shall return to China and resume my personal direction of the struggle."

### Return Not Likely

But developments in communist overrun China make it improbable that Li will be able to go home in the foreseeable future. He could return to the British crown colony of Hong Kong, where he had been hospitalized since Nov. 20. Illness is a tradi-

## Builder Of Klan Cross Testifies In Flogging Case

ROME, Ga., Dec. 9—(AP)—The man whose name has run through like through the case of seven Negroes said yesterday it all resulted from doing his job.

It was his job, said Deputy William Hartline, to build a cross.

Likewise, he added, it was his duty to go patrolling through Hooker, Ga., the night of April 2—the night the Negroes were flogged.

The 55-year-old sheriff's deputy took the stand in the mass civil rights trial here of ten Dade county men before Federal Judge Frank A. Hooper.

Hartline said he had been given the job of cross building by Ku Klux Klan Kludge Walter Arp the night before.

Though he denied membership in the Klan, Hartline admitted attending a meeting of the provincial Klavern in Dade county and accepting instructions from Arp for the cross building.

He said he not only built the cross but delivered it to Hooker Hill.

It was at Hooker, the government charges, that the seven Negroes were placed under false arrest by the Dade officers and surrendered to a KKK mob for beating.

The defense charged that Arp, a government witness, had led the Klansmen in the flogging.

Before the trial is over, Defense Attorney Frank W. Gleason promised he intends to prove his charge in support of his contention that the government has the wrong 10 men in court.
