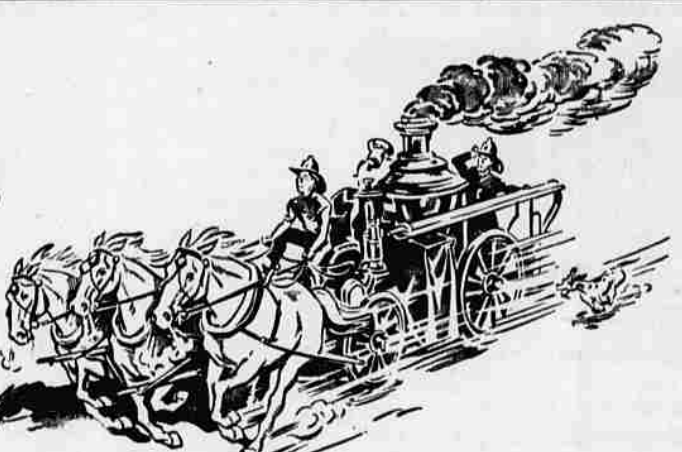
At that time, Nelson will also announce the name of the operating committee chairman for next year. All institutional representatives from each sponsoring organization should attend this meeting.

Farmers Told Of Deadline To Vote On PMA Groups

Douglas county farmers were reminded this week that they have only until December 15 to cast their ballots for Community Production and Marketing administration farmer committees and county convention delegates.

Any person who did not receive a ballot in the mail and believes he is eligible to vote should write, call or stop in at the county office, the chairman says.

In general, an eligible voter is an owner, operator, tenant, or share-cropper on a farm, and is eligible to participate in any program administered during 1949 through the county and community PMA committees. This includes the agricultural conservation program, the sugar program and the federal crop insurance program.
