ON INTERNATIONAL SCENE

Jessup To Study Far East; Britain To Recognize Red Regime In China, Forecast

(By The Associated Press)

U. S. roving Ambassador Philip C. Jessup is off today on a policy study tour of the far east. His findings are expected to shape America's future relations with neighboring countries of Communist China, and with Communist China itself.

Jessup probably will confer with Gen. Douglas MacArthur in Tokyo. In Bangkok he will meet top American diplomats from far eastern posts. They will discuss moves that may be made to contain the spread of Communist power.

Administration critics who looked for quicker action from the State department last week criticized Jessup for taking "a slow boat to China." He has a well

prepared program before him and a record of success in ticklish diplomatic spots. Jessup helped engineer the Soviet lifting of the Berlin blockade.

A responsible British source in London said Britain is pressing the United States and Canada to help launch a gigantic new aid program for the Middle East and Southern Asia. The idea is to save strategic potentially rich regions from falling into the Soviet orbit.

This source said the program is now being discussed at top-secret three-power talks now going on in Washington.

Garlic Diet To Navy Men Doesn't Repel Mosquitoes

TAMPA, Fla.—(AP)—The Navy describes an attempted weapon of the Pacific war which didn't pan out—garlic.

Capt. A. R. Behnke, a naval doctor, said garlic was fed to certain gobs in "large quantities" as a possible repellent for mosquitoes which plagued the navy's fighters.

But Behnke said, the "scooters" showed "complete indifference" to the aroma—and kept right on boring in.

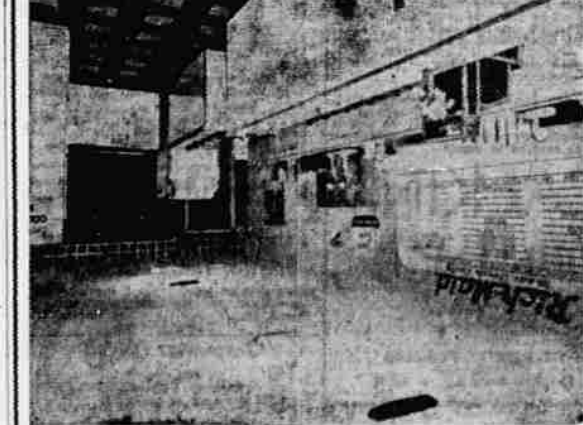
He offered no comment on how the garlicky guinea-pig sailors got along with the rest of the fleet.
